House Bill 2434

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Presession filed (at the request of Governor John A. Kitzhaber, M.D., for Oregon Business Development Department)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Directs Oregon Business Development Department to establish and administer Natural Resource Transformative Technology Grant Program for purpose of providing grants to assist Oregon's businesses and research institutions to invest in and commercialize transformative natural resource technologies in this state.

Establishes Natural Resource Transformative Technology Grant Program Fund and appropriates moneys in fund to department.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

1 A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to natural resource innovation; and declaring an emergency.
 - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - **SECTION 1.** The Legislative Assembly finds that:
 - (1) Oregon's rural economy is based primarily on natural resource industries, many of which offer innovative technologies and approaches to traditional practices for dealing with natural resources such as forest and wood products, agriculture and food processing.
 - (2) Oregon is witnessing a growth in agricultural and food products exported in both global and domestic markets, a trend that is being recognized by capital markets and investors.
 - (3) There has been a decline in mills and mill access to Oregon forests since the early 1980s with no likely reversal of this trend in the foreseeable future. As fire costs become a major share of state and federal agencies' budgets, new forestry harvest models have been developed, with opportunities for timber and wood industries to create new markets and demand for wood products internationally and domestically.
 - (4) The State of Oregon has a significant interest in supporting a targeted and proactive innovation strategy for the state's natural resources.
 - (5) Implementation and administration of the Natural Resource Transformative Technology Grant Program established under section 3 of this 2015 Act will further economic development by facilitating the development of natural resource industries and technologies, and encouraging quality job growth, in Oregon.
 - SECTION 2. As used in sections 1 to 4 of this 2015 Act:
 - (1) "Program" means the Natural Resource Transformative Technology Grant Program established under section 3 of this 2015 Act.
 - (2) "Research institution" has the meaning given that term in ORS 284.701.
 - SECTION 3. (1) The Oregon Business Development Department shall establish and administer the Natural Resource Transformative Technology Grant Program. The purpose of the program is to provide grants on a competitive basis to assist Oregon's businesses and

research institutions to invest in and commercialize transformative natural resource technologies in this state.

- (2)(a) The Oregon Business Development Department shall consult with the office of the Governor, the State Forestry Department, the State Department of Agriculture and the Regional Solutions Program established under section 3, chapter 82, Oregon Laws 2014, in the implementation and administration of the program.
- (b) The Oregon Business Development Department may appoint an advisory committee to advise the department with respect to rules, policies and procedures to implement and administer the program, and to identify qualified applicants and eligible projects for grant funds under this section.
- (3) The Oregon Business Development Department may award grants to successful applicants based upon the extent to which the goals and objectives of the applicant's business and research development plan encompass and demonstrate the following:
- (a) The facilitation of science and research that identifies new applications and product opportunities including, but not limited to, applications and opportunities for engineered wood products, products made from wood fiber, new crops, fiber or biomass from agricultural production;
- (b) Product testing for commercialization and product enhancement including, but not limited to, product testing of precision agriculture technologies such as drip irrigation, sensor technologies, unmanned aerial vehicles and traceability technology;
- (c) Pilot projects for tall wood buildings, building code review, research and development with respect to buildings containing engineered wood products; and
- (d) Commercialization, opportunities and technologies involving renewables and wood biomass potential.
- (4) Individuals, for-profit and nonprofit businesses, research institutions and Oregonbased foundations may apply to participate in the program by submitting an application in writing in a form prescribed by the Oregon Business Development Department by rule.
- (5)(a) The Oregon Business Development Department shall establish by rule criteria and standards for successful applicants for grants that are available through the program. At a minimum, an applicant must:
 - (A) Submit a detailed business and research development plan;
- (B) Provide proof of initial viability of the project contained in the business and research development plan; and
- (C) Demonstrate that the applicant is able to provide the type and amount of required match.
- (b) In determining eligibility of a project for a grant under this section, the department may give consideration to the extent to which an applicant can demonstrate that committed funds for the project are available from Oregon-based foundations, local communities and governments, the federal government or business and industry partners.
- (6) The Oregon Business Development Department shall establish by rule the type and amount of each grant available through the program, and the type and amount of any required match.
- (7) The Oregon Business Development Department shall collaborate with the Regional Solutions Program established under section 3, chapter 82, Oregon Laws 2014, to identify qualified applicants and eligible projects for grant funds that are available under the pro-

1 gram.

(8) The Oregon Business Development Department may solicit and accept contributions, donations, funds and assistance from the federal government and its agencies or from other sources, public or private, and agree to conditions not inconsistent with the purposes of sections 1 to 4 of this 2015 Act. All funds received are to be deposited into the Natural Resource Transformative Technology Grant Program Fund established under section 4 of this 2015 Act and used for the purposes designated in section 4 of this 2015 Act.

SECTION 4. The Natural Resource Transformative Technology Grant Program Fund is established in the State Treasury, separate and distinct from the General Fund. The Natural Resource Transformative Technology Grant Program Fund consists of moneys appropriated, allocated, deposited or transferred to the fund by the Legislative Assembly or otherwise and interest earned on moneys in the fund. Amounts in the fund are continuously appropriated to the Oregon Business Development Department for the purposes of making grants under section 3 of this 2015 Act and implementing and administering sections 1 to 4 of this 2015 Act. Interest earned on the fund shall be deposited into the fund.

SECTION 5. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Business Development Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$_______, for the purpose of making grants, and implementing and facilitating the provisions of sections 1 to 4 of this 2015 Act.

<u>SECTION 6.</u> This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on its passage.
