House Bill 2437

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Presession filed (at the request of Governor John A. Kitzhaber, M.D., for Oregon Business Development Department)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Permits Oregon Business Development Department to enter into agreements for loans, grants or other assistance, including but not limited to direct purchase of goods or services related to entrepreneurial and industry development.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to traded sector industry development activities by the Oregon Business Development De partment; amending ORS 285B.286; and declaring an emergency.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 285B.286, as amended by section 1, chapter 3, Oregon Laws 2014, is amended 6 to read:

285B.286. For traded sector industries, the Oregon Business Development Department shall
undertake entrepreneurial and industry development activities that may include, but are not limited
to, all of the following:

10 (1) Focus groups and other meetings and related studies to identify traded sector industry 11 members and issues of common concern within an industry.

12 (2) State technical and financial support for formation of industry associations, publication of 13 association directories and related efforts to create or expand the activities of industry associations.

14 (3) Helping establish research consortia as well as partnering with universities and other re-15 search institutions to assist in the retention and recruitment of targeted industries.

(4) Joint training and education programs and curricula related to the specific needs of tradedsector industries.

18 (5) Cooperative market and entrepreneurial development activities.

(6) Analysis of the need, feasibility and cost for establishing product certification and testingfacilities and services.

(7) State technical and financial support to facilitate certification of sites as ready for develop ment for traded sector industry. The support may include performing site assessments to determine
 the costs associated with development of individual sites.

(8) Assistance to traded sector and cluster affiliated Oregon businesses and consortia in making
 investments that advance entrepreneurial and industry-related development activities or other iden tified competitiveness objectives of existing Oregon cluster businesses.

(9) Assistance and support that promote regional economic development strategies fostering
 entrepreneurship and the development of targeted industry clusters in rural communities.

(10) Subject to applicable policies and procedures, entering into agreements for loans,
 grants or other assistance, including but not limited to direct purchase of goods or services

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- 1 related to entrepreneurial and industry development.
- 2 <u>SECTION 2.</u> This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public

peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect
 on its passage.

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
