

House Bill 2472

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Pre-session filed (at the request of Governor John A. Kitzhaber, M.D., for State Mortuary and Cemetery Board)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Modifies authority of State Mortuary and Cemetery Board to conduct investigations of premises and records of facilities that provide services related to final disposition of human remains.

2 Relating to investigations of facilities that provide services related to the final disposition of human
3 remains; amending ORS 692.320; and repealing ORS 692.387, 692.389, 692.391 and 692.393.

4 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 692.320 is amended to read:

6 692.320. (1) The State Mortuary and Cemetery Board may adopt and enforce rules for the pro-
7 tection of the public health, safety and welfare relating to the following:

8 (a) The licensing of or issuance of certificates of authority for funeral service practitioners,
9 embalmers, death care consultants, funeral establishments, crematoriums, cemeteries and other fa-
10 cilities for final disposition of human remains.

11 (b) The registration of apprentices.

12 (c) The practice of funeral service practitioners, embalmers and death care consultants, and the
13 operation of funeral establishments, immediate disposition companies, crematoriums, cemeteries and
14 other facilities for final disposition of human remains.

15 (d) Sanitary conditions of funeral establishments, crematoriums, cemeteries, other facilities for
16 final disposition of human remains and any location [*in*] **at** which human remains are stored, **tem-**
17 **porarily held** or processed prior to final disposition.

18 (e) Matters necessary to carry out the provisions of this chapter.

19 [*(2) Other than areas used as living quarters, the board shall inspect not less than once biennially*
20 *the facilities and records of funeral establishments, cemeteries, crematoriums and immediate disposition*
21 *companies, other facilities for final disposition of human remains and any location in which human*
22 *remains may be stored, temporarily held or processed prior to final disposition. The inspection of the*
23 *records of such locations is limited to those records required to comply with this chapter or ORS*
24 *chapter 432 or rules adopted pursuant thereto. The board may make random inspections at other times.*
25 *The board shall employ one or more persons to perform such inspections and aid in the enforcement*
26 *of this chapter and rules adopted thereunder. A person employed under this subsection may not be a*
27 *member of the board or actively engaged in a practice regulated by this chapter.]*

28 **(2) To ensure compliance with this chapter and ORS chapter 432 and rules adopted under**
29 **this chapter and ORS chapter 432, the board may conduct investigations of the premises and**
30 **records of funeral establishments, cemeteries, crematoriums, immediate disposition compa-**
31 **nies and other facilities for final disposition of human remains and any location at which**

1 **human remains may be stored, temporarily held or processed prior to final disposition.**

2 (3) The board may hold hearings, conduct investigations, subpoena witnesses, administer oaths
3 and take testimony in order to carry out the provisions of this chapter **and rules adopted under**
4 **this chapter.**

5 (4) The board shall have a common seal and, subject to any applicable provision of the State
6 Personnel Relations Law, may employ staff, fix the compensation for [*them*] **staff** and incur other
7 necessary expenses.

8 **SECTION 2. ORS 692.387, 692.389, 692.391 and 692.393 are repealed.**

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
