Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Presession filed (at the request of State Treasurer Ted Wheeler)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Authorizes issuance of pass-through revenue bonds for projects outside this state. Defines "within this state" in relation to construction of structures by institutions eligible to receive pass-through financing under authority of Oregon Facilities Authority.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

- 5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 289.005 is amended to read:
- 6 289.005. (1) As used in this chapter, unless the context requires otherwise:
- 7 [(1)] (a) "Authority" means the Oregon Facilities Authority created by this chapter.
- 8 [(2)] (b) "Bonds" or "revenue bonds" means revenue bonds, as defined in ORS 286A.001.
- 9 [(3)] (c) "Cost" means the cost of:
- [(a)] (A) Construction, acquisition, alteration, enlargement, reconstruction and remodeling of a
 project, including all lands, structures, real or personal property, rights, rights of way, air rights,
 franchises, easements and interests acquired or used for or in connection with a project;
- [(b)] (B) Demolition or removal of buildings or structures on land as acquired, including the cost
 of acquiring lands to which the buildings or structures may be moved;
- 15 [(c)] (C) All machinery and equipment;

[(d)] (D) Financing charges, interest prior to, during and for a period after completion of con struction and acquisition, reasonably required amounts to make the project operational, provisions
 for reserves for principal and interest and for extensions, enlargements, additions, replacements,
 renovations and improvements;

20 [(e)] (E) Architectural, actuarial engineering, financial and legal services, plans specifications, 21 studies, surveys, estimates of costs and of revenues, administrative expenses, expenses necessary or 22 incident to determining the feasibility or practicability of constructing the project;

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[(f)] (F) Management, operation or funding of a qualified program; and

24 [(g)] (G) Other expenses that are necessary or incident to a project, the financing of the project 25 or the placing of the project in operation.

[(4)] (d) "Cultural institution" means a public or nonprofit institution within this state which engages in the cultural, intellectual, scientific, environmental, educational or artistic enrichment of the people of this state. "Cultural institution" includes, without limitation, aquaria, botanical societies, historical societies, land conservation organizations, libraries, museums, performing arts associations or societies, scientific societies, wildlife conservation organizations and zoological societies.

1 "Cultural institution" does not mean any school or any institution primarily engaged in religious 2 or sectarian activities.

3 [(5)] (e) "Health care institution" means a public or nonprofit organization within this state that 4 provides health care and related services, including but not limited to the provision of inpatient and 5 outpatient care, diagnostic or therapeutic services, laboratory services, medicinal drugs, nursing 6 care, assisted living, elderly care and housing, including retirement communities, and equipment 7 used or useful for the provision of health care and related services.

8 [(6)] (f) "Housing institution" means a public or nonprofit organization within this state that 9 provides decent, affordable housing to low income persons.

10 [(7)] (g) "Institution" means a cultural institution, a health care institution, a housing institu-11 tion, an institution for higher education, an institution for prekindergarten through grade 12 edu-12 cation, a school for persons with disabilities or another nonprofit.

[(8)] (h) "Institution for higher education" means a public or nonprofit educational institution within this state authorized by law to provide a program of education beyond the high school level, including community colleges and associate degree granting institutions. "Institution for higher education" does not mean any school or any institution primarily engaged in religious or sectarian activities.

[(9)] (i) "Institution for prekindergarten through grade 12 education" means an Oregon prekindergarten as defined in ORS 329.170, a public educational institution within this state authorized by law to provide a program of education for kindergarten through grade 12 or a nonprofit educational institution within this state that provides a program of education for prekindergarten through grade 12 as a private school. "Institution for prekindergarten through grade 12 education" does not mean a school or institution primarily engaged in religious or sectarian activities.

[(10)] (j) "Nonprofit" means an institution, organization or entity within this state exempt from
 taxation under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code as defined in ORS 314.011.

[(11)(a)] (k)(A) "Project" means the financing or refinancing of the costs, including, without
 limitation, acquisition, construction, enlargement, remodeling, renovation, improvement, furnishing
 and equipping, of the following:

30 [(A)] (i) In the case of a participating institution that is an institution for higher education, an 31 institution for prekindergarten through grade 12 education or a school for persons with disabilities, a structure [or structures], within or outside this state, that is suitable for use as a dormitory or 32other multiunit housing facility for students, faculty, officers or employees, or a dining hall, student 33 34 union, administration building, academic building, library, laboratory, research facility, classroom, athletic facility, health care facility, maintenance, storage or utility facility and other structures or 35facilities, within or outside this state, that are related to any of the structures required or used 36 37 for the instruction of students, the conducting of research or the operation of an institution for 38 higher education, an institution for prekindergarten through grade 12 education or a school for persons with disabilities. [It shall also include] A project defined in this sub-subparagraph in-39 cludes landscaping, site preparation, furniture, equipment and machinery and other similar items 40 necessary or convenient for the operation of a particular facility or structure in the manner for 41 which its use is intended and [shall further include] also includes any furnishings, equipment, ma-42 chinery and other similar items necessary or convenient for the operation of an institution of higher 43 education, an institution for prekindergarten through grade 12 education or a school for persons 44 with disabilities, whether or not [such] the items are related to a particular facility or structure fi-45

2 [(B)] (ii) In the case of a participating institution that is a housing institution, a structure [or structures], within or outside this state, that is suitable for use as housing, including residences 3 or multiunit housing facilities, administration buildings, maintenance, storage or utility facilities and 4 other structures or facilities, within or outside this state, that are related to any of the struc- $\mathbf{5}$ tures required or used for the operation of the housing, including parking and other facilities or 6 structures essential or convenient for the orderly provision of [such] the housing. [It shall also in-7 clude] A project defined in this sub-subparagraph includes landscaping, site preparation, furni-8 9 ture, equipment and machinery and other similar items necessary or convenient for the particular housing facility or structure in the manner for which its use is intended and [shall further include] 10 also includes any furnishings, equipment, machinery and other similar items necessary or conven-11 12 ient for the provision of housing, whether or not [such] the items are related to a particular facility 13 or structure financed under this chapter.

[(C)] (iii) In the case of a participating institution that is a cultural institution, a structure [or 14 15 structures], within or outside this state, that is suitable for [its] the institution's purposes, 16 whether or not to be used to provide educational services, or research resources, including use as or in connection with an administrative facility, aquarium, assembly hall, auditorium, botanical 17 18 garden, exhibition hall, gallery, greenhouse, library, museum, scientific laboratory, theater or 19 zoological facility. [It shall also include] A project defined in this sub-subparagraph includes 20 supporting facilities, landscaping, site preparation, furniture, equipment, machinery and other similar 21items necessary or convenient for the operation of a cultural institution, whether or not [such] the 22items are related to a particular facility or structure financed under this chapter, including books, 23works of art or other items for display or exhibition.

[(D)] (iv) In the case of a participating institution that is a health care institution, a structure 94 25[or structures], within or outside this state, that is suitable for [its] the institution's purposes, including hospital facilities, inpatient and outpatient clinics, doctors' offices, administration 2627buildings, parking, maintenance, storage or utility facilities, nursing care or assisted living facilities, elderly care and housing facilities, including retirement communities, and other structures or facil-28ities, within or outside this state, that are related to any of the structures required or used for 2930 the operation of the health care institution, including other facilities or structures essential or 31 convenient for the orderly provision of [such] the health care. [It shall also include] A project defined in this sub-subparagraph includes landscaping, site preparation, furniture, equipment and 32machinery and other similar items necessary or convenient for the particular health care facility 33 34 or structure in the manner for which its use is intended and [shall further include] also includes any working capital, furnishings, equipment, machinery and other similar items necessary or con-3536 venient for the provision of health care, whether or not [such] the items are related to a particular 37 facility or structure financed under this chapter.

38 [(E)] (v) In the case of a participating institution that is a nonprofit not otherwise specified in this [subsection] paragraph, a structure [or structures], within or outside this state, that is suit-39 able for [its] the institution's purposes, including facilities or structures essential or convenient for 40 the orderly operations of the nonprofit. [It shall also include] A project defined in this sub-41 42subparagraph includes acquisition of interests in land, landscaping, site preparation, furniture, equipment and machinery and other similar items necessary or convenient for the nonprofit, whether 43 or not the items are related to a particular facility or structure financed under this chapter, in-44 cluding borrowings needed to alleviate interim cash flow deficits of the nonprofit. 45

1 [(F)] (vi) In the case of a participating institution, costs to manage, operate or fund a qualified 2 program or costs to alleviate interim cash flow deficits of the institution.

3 [(b)] (B) "Project" also includes any combination of one or more of the projects undertaken 4 jointly by one or more participating institutions with each other or with other parties.

5 [(c)] (C) "Project" does not include the financing or refinancing of the costs of a facility used 6 or to be used for sectarian instruction or as a place of religious worship or any facility which is 7 used or to be used primarily in connection with any part of the program of a school or department 8 of divinity for any religious denomination.

9 [(12)] (L) "Qualified program" means a financing program, or other activities, of a participating 10 institution that is eligible for financing through the issuance of revenue bonds the interest on which 11 is:

12 [(a)] (A) Excluded from gross income for federal income tax purposes; or

13 [(b)] (**B**) Eligible for a federal tax credit or subsidy under the Internal Revenue Code.

[(13)] (m) "School for persons with disabilities" means a public or nonprofit primary, secondary or post-secondary school within **or outside** this state that serves students at least 70 percent of whom are persons with disabilities as determined by one or more appropriate education, rehabilitation, medical or mental health authorities[;], is accredited by a recognized accrediting body[;] and is determined by the authority to be a major resource of benefit to persons with disabilities. "School for persons with disabilities" does not mean any school or any institution primarily engaged in religious or sectarian activities.

(2) As used in subsection (1) of this section in relation to an institution, "within this
 state" means that the institution:

(a) Has its primary place of business in the State of Oregon or conducts a substantial
 portion of its operations in the State of Oregon; or

(b) Is owned by, or affiliated under common ownership with, an institution described in
 paragraph (a) of this subsection.

(3) As used in subsection (1) of this section in relation to a project, "within this state"
 means that:

29 (a) A structure to be financed will be located in the State of Oregon; or

30 (b) The institution is within this state.

31 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 3 of this 2015 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 289.

32 <u>SECTION 3.</u> (1) As used in this section, "within the State of Oregon" has the meaning 33 given the term "within this state" in ORS 289.005.

(2) Interest on revenue bonds issued by the State Treasurer under the authority of this
 chapter is exempt from personal income tax under ORS chapter 316 only to the extent that
 the bond proceeds generating the interest are used to finance structures that are located
 within the State of Oregon.

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SECTION 4. ORS 286A.140 is amended to read:

286A.140. Except as provided in section 3 of this 2015 Act, interest on all bonds of the State
 of Oregon is exempt from personal income tax under ORS chapter 316.

41 **SECTION 5.** ORS 316.056 is amended to read:

316.056. (1) In addition to the modifications to federal taxable income contained in this chapter,
there shall be subtracted from federal taxable income, to the extent includable in gross income

44 for federal income tax purposes, the interest or dividends on obligations of:

45 (a) The State of Oregon [or] pursuant to ORS 286A.140.

(b) A public body, as defined in ORS 287A.001.[, to the extent includable in gross income for
federal income tax purposes. However,]
(2) The amount subtracted under this section [shall] must be reduced by any interest on
indebtedness incurred to carry the obligations or securities described in this section, and by any
expenses incurred in the production of interest or dividend income described in this section.
<u>SECTION 6.</u> This 2015 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2015
regular session of the Seventy-eighth Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.
