SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure

[Directs Department of Veterans' Affairs to submit report related to delivery and usage of medical services by women veterans to interim legislative committees no later than July 1, 2016.]

Directs Department of Veterans' Affairs to enter into contract to conduct statewide study regarding delivery and use of, and barriers to access to, health care and medical services for women veterans no later than July 1, 2016.

Requires department to submit report regarding study to interim legislative committees no later than November 1, 2016.

Sunsets January 2, 2017.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT 2 Relating to medical services for women veterans; and declaring an emergency. 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 4 SECTION 1. (1) No later than July 1, 2016, the Department of Veterans' Affairs shall enter into a contract to conduct a statewide study regarding the delivery and use of, and 5 6 barriers to access to, health care and medical services for women veterans. The study must 7 include: 8 (a) A description of the type and availability of medical services for women veterans in 9 this state: (b) Findings regarding accessibility, usage and barriers to accessibility and usage of 10 medical services by women veterans in this state; and 11 12(c) Recommendations for legislative or other changes that may result in better delivery, 13 accessibility and usage of medical services by women veterans. (2) No later than November 1, 2016, the department shall submit a report to the interim 14 15 legislative committees that have authority over the subject area of veterans' affairs regard-16 ing the study conducted in accordance with subsection (1) of this section. 17 SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2015 Act is repealed on January 2, 2017. SECTION 3. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 18 19 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on its passage. 20 21
