House Bill 2554

Sponsored by Representative GREENLICK (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Requires Department of Consumer and Business Services to determine official rate of medical care inflation to be used by insurers in determining premium rates.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to inflation in costs of medical care; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2015 Act is added to and made a part of the Insurance Code. SECTION 2. (1) The Department of Consumer and Business Services shall establish by rule a methodology for projecting anticipated changes in medical costs over the course of a calendar year. Not later than March 31 of each year, the department shall apply the methodology to determine the official rate of medical care inflation for the next calendar year. The department shall establish the official rate of medical care inflation using the department's actuaries and under the guidance of an advisory committee of actuaries appointed by the department and other experts that the department deems necessary.

- (2) An insurer must use the official rate of medical care inflation established under subsection (1) of this section in calculating the insurer's premium rates in subsequent rate filings under ORS 743.018, unless the insurer can present to the department compelling evidence of special factors that would make the application of the official rate unjust, including but not limited to:
- (a) The unique characteristics of the policyholder or certificate holders of a health benefit plan; or
- (b) Utilization controls used in a health benefit plan that would cause the rate of medical inflation for that plan to vary from the official rate.
- (3) The department shall use a public process to establish the official rate of medical care inflation. The public process and all documents used, produced or considered in the process are subject to public records and open meetings laws under ORS 192.410 to 192.505 and 192.610 to 192.690.
- (4) Members of the advisory committee of actuaries and other experts who are not state employees are entitled to compensation and expenses incurred by them in the performance of their official duties in the manner and amounts provided for in ORS 292.495. Claims for compensation and expenses shall be paid out of the Consumer and Business Services Fund.

SECTION 3. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on its passage.

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
