

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2567

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 3, after “471.230” insert “; and declaring an emergency”.

2 Delete lines 5 through 28 and delete page 2 and insert:

3 “**SECTION 1.** ORS 471.230 is amended to read:

4 “471.230. (1) A distillery license allows the licensee to import, manufacture, distill, rectify, blend,
5 denature and store spirits of an alcoholic content greater than 17 percent alcohol by weight, to sell
6 the spirits to the Oregon Liquor Control Commission and to transport the spirits out of this state
7 for sale outside this state. [*Distillery licensees are permitted to purchase from and through the com-
8 mission alcoholic beverages for blending and manufacturing purposes upon such terms and conditions
9 as the commission may provide.*] **Distillery licensees may purchase and sell distilled liquor from
10 or to another distillery licensee in containers having a capacity greater than one U.S. gallon
11 for blending and manufacturing purposes.** A distillery licensee may not sell any alcoholic
12 beverage within this state except to the commission or as provided in this section. However, any
13 agricultural producer or association of agricultural producers or the legal agents of an agricultural
14 producer or association of agricultural producers that manufactures and converts agricultural sur-
15 pluses, by-products and wastes into denatured ethyl and industrial alcohol for use in the arts and
16 industry are not required to obtain a license from the commission.

17 “(2) [A] **If a distillery licensee holds a valid distilled spirits plant basic permit issued by
18 the federal Alcohol and Tobacco Tax and Trade Bureau for the licensed premises, the
19 distillery licensee may:**

20 “(a) Permit tastings of [*the*] distilled liquor [*manufactured*] **approved by the commission for
21 sale in Oregon and manufactured in Oregon** by the distillery licensee **or by another distillery
22 licensee. Tastings may be of the distilled liquor alone or with a mix of other liquids.** The
23 tastings may be conducted on the licensed premises of the distillery and at no more than five other
24 premises owned or leased by the licensee. [*The licensee must purchase the distilled liquor from the
25 commission.*] **The commission may allow more than one distillery licensee to use the same
26 premises at the same time for conducting tastings. If the manufacturer of the distilled liquor
27 obtains distilled liquor for conducting tastings from the inventory of the commission, the
28 licensee shall pay the commission a processing fee.**

29 “(b) Obtain a special events distillery license.

30 “(c) Apply for appointment by the commission as a distillery retail outlet agent for purposes of
31 retailing [*only*] distilled liquor that the licensee manufactured in Oregon at locations where tastings
32 are permitted under paragraph (a) of this subsection or subsection (4)(a) of this section. **A distillery
33 retail outlet agent may sell only distilled liquor that is manufactured in Oregon and on the
34 list of products approved by the commission for retail sale in Oregon.**

35 “(d) **If appointed under paragraph (c) of this subsection as a distillery retail outlet agent,**

1 **sell at retail containers of distilled liquor manufactured by any other distillery retail outlet**
2 **agent that is authorized by the commission under paragraph (c) of this subsection.**

3 “(3) Notwithstanding ORS 471.392 to 471.400, a distillery licensee may also hold a full on-
4 premises sales license for a location at the licensed premises of the distillery and a full on-premises
5 sales license for one other location. All distilled spirits sold under the full on-premises sales license
6 must be purchased from the commission.

7 “[*(4)(a) A distillery licensee that holds a special events distillery license may conduct an event on*
8 *a premises at a designated location other than the location set forth in the distillery license for a period*
9 *not exceeding five days. A distillery licensee conducting an event may:*]

10 “[*(A) Permit tastings of distilled liquor manufactured by the distillery.*]

11 “[*(B) Permit sales by the drink of distilled liquor manufactured by the distillery.*]

12 “[*(C) If the distillery licensee has been appointed as a distillery retail outlet agent under subsection*
13 *(2)(c) of this section, sell factory sealed containers of distilled liquor manufactured by the distillery for*
14 *consumption off the licensed premises of the event.*]

15 “(4) **A distillery licensee that holds a special events distillery license may conduct an**
16 **event on a premises at a location designated in the special events distillery license for a pe-**
17 **riod not exceeding five days. The commission may license more than one distillery licensee**
18 **to hold a special event on the same premises at the same time. A distillery licensee con-**
19 **ducting an event may:**

20 “(a) **Permit tastings of distilled liquor approved by the commission for sale in Oregon and**
21 **manufactured in Oregon by the distillery licensee or by another distillery licensee. Tastings**
22 **may be of the distilled liquor alone or with a mix of other liquids. If the manufacturer of the**
23 **distilled liquor obtains distilled liquor for conducting tastings from the inventory of the**
24 **commission, the licensee shall pay the commission a processing fee.**

25 “(b) **Permit sales by the drink of distilled liquor. A drink that a distillery licensee sells**
26 **under this paragraph must include distilled liquor that the licensee manufactured in Oregon.**
27 **Any distilled liquor contained in the drink must be on the list of products approved by the**
28 **commission for retail sale in Oregon. The distillery licensee selling the drink must purchase**
29 **all distilled liquor contained in the drink at the retail price set by the commission for the**
30 **month in which the drink is sold.**

31 “(c) **If the distillery licensee has been appointed as a distillery retail outlet agent under**
32 **subsection (2)(c) of this section, sell distilled liquor in factory-sealed containers for con-**
33 **sumption off the licensed premises of the event. Distilled liquor sold under this paragraph**
34 **must be manufactured in Oregon, be on the list of products approved by the commission for**
35 **retail sale in Oregon and be sold at the retail price set by the commission for the month of**
36 **sale. The distilled liquor must have been manufactured by the distillery licensee or manu-**
37 **factured by another distillery licensee licensed by the commission to hold a special event on**
38 **the same premises at the same time.**

39 “[*(b) A distillery licensee that holds a special events distillery license:*]

40 “[*(A) Must purchase distilled liquor that the licensee uses for conducting tastings at the event from*
41 *the commission at the price set by the commission for distilled liquor removed from bond for*
42 *tastings.*]

43 “[*(B) Must purchase distilled liquor that the licensee uses for sales by the drink at the event at the*
44 *retail price set by the commission for the month in which the distilled liquor is sold by the drink.*]

45 “[*(C) Must purchase distilled liquor that the licensee sells in factory sealed containers at the event*]

1 *at the retail price set by the commission for the month in which the licensee makes the purchase.]*

2 *“(D) Must sell distilled liquor described in subparagraph (C) of this paragraph at the retail price*
3 *set by the commission for the month in which the licensee makes the sale.]*

4 **“SECTION 2. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
5 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect**
6 **on its passage.”.**
