## House Bill 2594

Sponsored by Representative BUCKLEY (Presession filed.)

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Requires insurer of liable party to pay actual costs of emergency response by private emergency responders.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to emergency response by private entities. Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 3 SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2015 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 746. 4 SECTION 2. (1) As used in this section: 5 (a) "Emergency" has the meaning given that term in ORS 401.025. 6 7 (b) "Private emergency responder" means a private entity, and individuals working under 8 the direction of the private entity, that provides subject matter expertise or technical expe-9 rience that may be called upon to participate in the response to an emergency, including, but not limited to, the following entities, if private: 10 (A) Firefighting agencies; 11 12 (B) Ambulance services; 13 (C) Crime scene investigators and forensic analysts; (D) Hazardous materials response teams; 14 (E) Geologists, volcanologists and other scientists; 15 (F) Pilots, air crew and others that support air response to an emergency; 16 (G) Boat captains, crew and others that support open-water emergency response; and 17 (H) Search and rescue teams. 18 (2) When the insurer of a liable party is obligated to reimburse a private emergency 19 20 responder for services provided in response to an emergency, the insurer shall reimburse the private emergency responder for the actual costs incurred for emergency response, includ-21 ing, but not limited to, costs associated with mobile laboratories, tools and equipment for 22

handling hazardous materials and other specialized equipment.
