## House Bill 2624

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Directs Oregon Education Investment Board and Department of Education to advance career and technical education opportunities by fulfilling specified requirements.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Education for purpose of complying

with requirements.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2015.

- Relating to career and technical education; creating new provisions; amending section 10, chapter 519, Oregon Laws 2011; and declaring an emergency.
- Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- SECTION 1. To accomplish the policy on career and technical education described in ORS 344.055, the Oregon Education Investment Board and the Department of Education shall:
- (1) Permanently dedicate staff to advancing the policy in the manner described in section 4 of this 2015 Act.
- (2) Seek funding for and administer grants that provide professional development or incentives to teachers of career and technical education.
- (3) Develop and implement incentives for employers to sponsor teachers of career and technical education.
- (4) Collaborate with the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission to enable experts in trade or industry to become teachers of career and technical education, which may be accomplished through a limited license or alternative requirements for licensure.
- (5) Develop and provide training on career and technical education and hands-on career and technical education experiences to licensed teachers.
- (6) Review statutes for necessary changes and review funding options to increase available funding.
- **SECTION 2.** Section 1 of this 2015 Act is amended to read:
- 21 **Sec. 1.** To accomplish the policy on career and technical education described in ORS 344.055, 22 [the Oregon Education Investment Board and] the Department of Education shall:
- (1) Permanently dedicate staff to advancing the policy in the manner described in section 4 of 23 this 2015 Act. 24

    - <u>SECTION 4.</u> The Department of Education shall permanently dedicate staff to advancing the policy on career and technical education as described in ORS 344.055. The staff shall:
    - (1) Establish and regularly update a teacher preparation program for teachers interested in becoming career and technical education teachers. The program must:
  - (a) Offer at least 18 hours of credits online, but may offer additional hours of credits in classrooms;
    - (b) Include evaluation criteria; and
    - (c) Be established and updated based on input from the public and stakeholders.
  - (2) Coordinate communications about career and technical education, including communications:
    - (a) Intended to identify potential teachers of career and technical education.
  - (b) With experts in trades or industry about the requirements of transitioning to teach-

- (c) With teacher education programs about teaching opportunities related to career and technical education.
- (d) With school districts about best practices for offering career and technical education and model contract language for teachers of career and technical education.
  - (3) Develop and maintain a website where:
  - (a) School districts may post job openings related to career and technical education.
- (b) Teacher education programs may provide information about on-demand career and technical education courses.
- (c) A public or private entity may provide information about professional development opportunities for career and technical education teachers.

SECTION 5. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Department of Education, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$\_\_\_\_\_\_, which may be expended for section 1 of this 2015 Act.

SECTION 6. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect July 1, 2015.
