SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Authorizes State Treasurer to issue lottery bonds to finance grants from Department of Education to school districts to pay for acquisition, construction or improvement of school-based health centers.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

1 A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to financing the development of school-based health centers; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

- SECTION 1. (1) For the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, at the request of the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, after the department consults with the Department of Education, the State Treasurer is authorized to issue lottery bonds pursuant to ORS 286A.560 to 286A.585 in an amount that produces \$______ in net proceeds and interest earnings for the purpose described in subsection (2) of this section, plus an additional amount estimated by the State Treasurer to be necessary to pay bond-related costs.
- (2) Net proceeds of lottery bonds issued under this section, and interest earnings, in an amount sufficient to provide \$_____ must be transferred to the Department of Education for deposit in the Oregon School-Based Health Center Construction Grant Fund established in section 2 of this 2015 Act to finance grants to school districts for the acquisition, construction or improvement of school-based health centers, as defined in ORS 413.225.
- (3) The Legislative Assembly finds that the use of lottery bond proceeds will create jobs, further economic development, finance public education or restore and protect parks, beaches, watersheds and native fish and wildlife, and is authorized based on the following findings:
- (a) Health disparities between students affect educational achievement and school-based health centers have a proven history of decreasing health disparities and improving school performance.
 - (b) The construction and operation of school-based health centers:
 - (A) Creates jobs during and after construction;
 - (B) Improves the health and academic performance of students; and
- (C) Improves the preparation of students to participate successfully in employment settings and other economic activity in Oregon.
- <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) The Oregon School-Based Health Center Construction Grant Fund is established in the State Treasury, separate and distinct from the General Fund. Interest earned on the moneys in the Oregon School-Based Health Center Construction Grant Fund

(2) Moneys in the fund are continuously appropriated to the Department of Education for disbursement as grants to school districts to pay for the acquisition, construction or improvement of school-based health centers, as defined in ORS 413.225.

SECTION 3. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on its passage.
