House Bill 2641

Sponsored by Representative GOMBERG; Senator COURTNEY (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Establishes requirements for awarding animal as prize. Creates crime of unlawfully awarding an animal as a prize. Punishes by maximum of 6 months' imprisonment, \$2,500 fine, or both.

- 2 Relating to awarding animals as prizes.
 - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2015 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 167.310 to 167.351.
 - <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) Prior to awarding an animal as a prize in a contest, drawing, sweepstakes, lottery or other similar event, a person shall:
 - (a) Ensure that the animal is provided with at least minimum care prior to the contest, drawing, sweepstakes, lottery or other event;
 - (b) Ensure that the animal is not chased, kicked or otherwise subjected to offensive physical contact prior to or during the contest, drawing, sweepstakes, lottery or other event;
 - (c) Enter into a written agreement with every potential recipient of the animal that includes:
 - (A) A signed statement by the potential recipient or, if the potential recipient is under 18 years of age, the potential recipient's parent or a legal guardian residing with the potential recipient, affirming that the potential recipient is aware that the potential recipient could become legally responsible for providing minimum care for an animal;
 - (B) A policy allowing the potential recipient to, without consequence, return the animal to the person for a period of up to six months after the contest, drawing, sweepstakes, lottery or other event; and
 - (C) Valid current contact information for the person; and
 - (d) Provide an animal care instruction sheet, specific to the species of animal awarded as a prize, to every potential recipient of the animal.
 - (2) A person commits the crime of unlawfully awarding an animal as a prize if the person knowingly transfers an animal to another person as a prize in a contest, drawing, sweepstakes, lottery or other similar event in violation of subsection (1) of this section.
 - (3) Unlawfully awarding an animal as a prize is a Class B misdemeanor.
