House Bill 2651

Sponsored by Representative GORSEK; Representatives LIVELY, REARDON (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Requires police officer or certified reserve officer employed or utilized by law enforcement unit that employs at least 20 police officers to have associate degree. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to the training of law enforcement officers; creating new provisions; amending ORS 181.665;

3 and declaring an emergency.

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4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 181.665 is amended to read:

6 181.665. (1) Except for a person who has requested and obtained an extension from the Depart-7 ment of Public Safety Standards and Training pursuant to subsection (2) of this section, a person 8 may not be employed as a police officer, or utilized as a certified reserve officer, by any law 9 enforcement unit for more than 18 months unless:

10 (a)(A) The person is a citizen of the United States; and

11 [(b)] (B) The person has been certified as being qualified as a police officer or certified reserve 12 officer under the provisions of ORS 181.610 to 181.712 and the certification has neither lapsed nor 13 been revoked pursuant to ORS 181.661, 181.662 and 181.664 (1) and not been reissued under ORS 14 181.664 (2)[.]; and

(b) If the law enforcement unit employing or utilizing the officer employs 20 or more
 police officers, the person has received at least an associate degree, in any subject, requiring
 90 to 102 credit hours.

(2) The department, upon the facts contained in an affidavit accompanying the request for an extension, may find good cause for failure to obtain certification within the time period described in subsection (1) of this section. If the department finds that there is good cause for such failure, the department may extend for up to one year the period that a person may serve as a police officer or reserve officer without certification. The grant or denial of such an extension is within the sole discretion of the department.

(3) Except as provided in subsection (4) of this section, a person employed as a police officer
by any law enforcement unit shall commence the training necessary for certification under ORS
181.610 to 181.712 at an academy operated by the department not later than the 90th day after the
date of the officer's employment by the law enforcement unit.

(4) A law enforcement unit may delay the commencement of training of a police officer for up
to 120 days from the date of the officer's employment when it considers the delay necessary. When
a law enforcement unit delays commencement of a police officer's training under this subsection, it
shall file a written statement of its reasons with the department.

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(5) When a delay in the commencement of training necessary for certification under ORS 181.610 1 $\mathbf{2}$ to 181.712 at an academy operated by the department is caused by the inability of the department, 3 for any reason, to provide that training, the period of such delay shall not be counted as part of the periods set forth in subsections (3) and (4) of this section within which the training must be com-4 menced. $\mathbf{5}$ (6) A person utilized as a certified reserve officer by a law enforcement unit must complete the 6 training necessary for certification under ORS 181.610 to 181.712 at a site approved by the depart-7ment. 8 9 (7) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the law enforcement unit described in ORS

10 181.610 (12)(e) shall bear the expense of training necessary for certification under ORS 181.610 to 11 181.712.

12 <u>SECTION 2.</u> The amendments to ORS 181.665 by section 1 of this 2015 Act apply to per-13 sons first employed as police officers or first utilized as certified reserve officers on or after 14 the effective date of this 2015 Act.

15 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 16 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect 17 on its passage.

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
