SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Removes entering or remaining unlawfully in public transit vehicle or public transit station as manner of committing crime of interfering with public transportation.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2	Relating to interfering with public transportation; amending ORS 166.116.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. ORS 166.116 is amended to read:
5	166.116. (1) A person commits the crime of interfering with public transportation if the person:
6	[(a) Intentionally or knowingly enters or remains unlawfully in or on a public transit vehicle or
7	public transit station;]
8	[(b)] (a) Intentionally or knowingly interferes with the provision or use of public transportation
9	services by, among other things, interfering with the movement of, or access to, public transit ve-
10	hicles;
11	[(c)] (b) While in or on a public transit vehicle or public transit station, engages in disorderly
12	conduct in the second degree as defined in ORS 166.025; or
13	[(d)] (c) Subjects a public transportation passenger, employee, agent or security officer or transit
14	police officer to offensive physical contact.
15	(2) Interfering with public transportation is a Class A misdemeanor.
16	(3) As used in this section:
17	[(a) "Enter or remain unlawfully" has the meaning given that term in ORS 164.205.]
18	[(b)] (a) "Public transit station" includes all facilities, structures, lands and rights of way that
19	are owned, leased, held or used for the purposes of providing public transportation services.
20	[(c)] (b) "Public transit vehicle" means a vehicle that is used for public transportation or oper-
21	ated by or under contract to any public body in order to provide public transportation.
22	[(d)] (c) "Public transportation" means transportation provided by a city, county, special district

or any other political subdivision or municipal or public corporation.
