## House Bill 2853

Sponsored by Representative WHISNANT

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Specifies minimum number of instructional days that class schedule adopted by district school board must provide. Takes effect July 1, 2016.

A BILL FOR AN ACT 1 2 Relating to a required number of instructional days; and prescribing an effective date. Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 3 SECTION 1. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, each district school 4 board shall adopt a class schedule that provides no fewer than 180 instructional days each  $\mathbf{5}$ school year to students who attend a school of the school district. 6 7 (2) If a school district has a four-day school week, a district school board may adopt a 8 class schedule that provides fewer than 180 instructional days each school year. (3) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules that establish the standards of an in-9 structional day. Rules adopted under this subsection may require different minimum and 10 maximum numbers of hours in an instructional day according to: 11 12 (a) The grade level of the student. (b) Whether the school district has a four-day school week or a five-day school week. 13SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2015 Act first applies to the 2016-2017 school year. 14 SECTION 3. This 2015 Act takes effect on July 1, 2016. 15 16
