House Bill 2944

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires Legislative Assembly or Secretary of State to hold public hearings throughout state prior to adopting congressional or legislative reapportionment plan.

2	Relating to reapportionment.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2015 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 188.010 to
5	188.295.
6	SECTION 2. (1) When apportioning the state into congressional or legislative districts,
7	the Legislative Assembly or the Secretary of State, whichever is applicable, shall:
8	(a) Hold at least 15 public hearings at locations throughout this state prior to proposing
9	a reapportionment plan; and
10	(b) Hold at least five public hearings at locations throughout this state after a reappor-
11	tionment plan is proposed, but before the plan is adopted.
12	(2) In holding the hearings required under subsection (1) of this section, the Legislative
13	Assembly or the Secretary of State, whichever is applicable, must:
14	(a) Provide appropriate public notice of the time and location of each hearing;
15	(b) Hold no more than one hearing required under subsection (1)(a) of this section in any
16	single legislative Senate district and ensure, to the extent practicable, that all hearings re-
17	quired under subsection (1)(a) of this section are distributed equally throughout this state;
18	(c) Hold no more than one hearing required under subsection (1)(b) of this section in any
19	single legislative Senate district and ensure, to the extent practicable, that all hearings re-
20	quired under subsection (1)(b) of this section are held in the greatest population density
21	areas in this state; and
22	(d) Permit and make provision for individuals at remote sites throughout this state to
23	provide public testimony at the hearings through the use of video equipment.
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
