## House Bill 2947

Sponsored by Representative WITT

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Increases required bond for residential general contractor.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT 1 $^{2}$ Relating to residential contractor bonding; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 701.081. 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: **SECTION 1.** ORS 701.081 is amended to read: 4 5 701.081. (1) A residential general contractor shall: (a) Obtain a surety bond under ORS 701.068 in the amount of [\$20,000] \$50,000; 6 (b) Obtain general liability insurance under ORS 701.073 in an amount of not less than \$500,000; 7 8 and 9 (c) Have a responsible managing individual who meets the requirements of ORS 701.091. 10 (2) A residential specialty contractor shall: 11 (a) Obtain a surety bond under ORS 701.068 in the amount of \$15,000; (b) Obtain general liability insurance under ORS 701.073 in an amount not less than \$300,000; 12 13 and (c) Have a responsible managing individual who meets the requirements of ORS 701.091. 14 15 (3) A residential limited contractor shall: (a) Obtain a surety bond under ORS 701.068 in the amount of \$10,000; 16 (b) Obtain general liability insurance under ORS 701.073 in an amount not less than \$100,000; 17 18 and (c) Have a responsible managing individual who meets the requirements of ORS 701.091. 19 (4) A residential developer shall: 20 (a) Obtain a surety bond under ORS 701.068 in the amount of \$20,000; and 21 22 (b) Obtain general liability insurance under ORS 701.073 in an amount not less than \$500,000. 23 (5) A residential locksmith services contractor shall: (a) Obtain a surety bond under ORS 701.068 in the amount of \$10,000; 24 (b) Obtain general liability insurance under ORS 701.073 in an amount of not less than \$100,000; 25 26 and 27 (c) Have a responsible managing individual for the business who is certified as a locksmith un-

(b) Obtain general liability insurance under ORS 701.073 in an amount of not less than \$100,000;

(a) Obtain a surety bond under ORS 701.068 in the amount of \$10,000;

and

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(6) A home inspector services contractor shall:

- (c) Have a responsible managing individual for the business who is certified as a home inspector under ORS 701.350.
  - (7) A home services contractor shall:

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- (a) Obtain a surety bond under ORS 701.068 in the amount of \$10,000; and
- (b) Obtain general liability insurance under ORS 701.073 in an amount of not less than \$100,000.
  - (8) A home energy performance score contractor shall:
  - (a) Obtain a surety bond under ORS 701.068 in the amount of \$10,000;
- 8 (b) Obtain general liability insurance under ORS 701.073 in an amount of not less than \$100,000; 9 and
  - (c) Have an owner or employee that is certified by the board as a home energy assessor.
  - SECTION 2. (1) A residential general contractor shall file any new or additional bonds necessary for compliance with ORS 701.081 (1)(a) with the Construction Contractors Board no later than 90 days after the effective date of this 2015 Act. However, any person filing a license application under ORS 701.068 (1) on or after the effective date of this 2015 Act must file a bond in the amount described in ORS 701.081 (1)(a) with the application. This subsection does not apply to a person required by the board under ORS 701.068 (6) to have a bond that exceeds the amount required under ORS 701.081 (1)(a).
  - (2) Notwithstanding ORS 701.098 and 701.992, if a residential general contractor that is subject to the 90-day filing deadline established in subsection (1) of this section maintains a bond of at least \$20,000 the board may not impose a license suspension or revocation or civil penalty on the contractor for a failure to comply with ORS 701.081 (1)(a) prior to the 90-day filing deadline.

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
