House Bill 2980

Sponsored by Representative BENTZ; Representatives BARKER, KRIEGER, OLSON, Senator FERRIOLI (at the request of Oregon District Attorneys Association)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Authorizes defendant to request district attorney to approve extension of stay of criminal proceedings for district attorney diversion. Requires court to extend stay upon approval of request by district attorney.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to district attorney diversion; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 135.896.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 135.896 is amended to read:

5 135.896. (1) If the district attorney elects to offer diversion in lieu of further criminal pro-6 ceedings and the defendant, with the advice of counsel, agrees to the terms of the proposed agree-7 ment, including a waiver of the right to a speedy trial, the court shall stay further criminal 8 proceedings for a definite period. Except as provided in ORS 135.898 **and subsection (2) of this** 9 **section**, the stay shall not exceed 270 days in the case of a defendant charged with commission of 10 a felony, and shall not exceed 180 days in the case of a defendant charged with the commission of 11 a misdemeanor. If the defendant declines diversion, the court shall resume criminal proceedings.

(2) Within 30 days prior to the end of the stay of criminal proceedings described in subsection (1) of this section, the defendant may request that the district attorney approve an extension of the stay for a period up to 270 days in the case of a defendant charged with the commission of a felony and up to 180 days in the case of a defendant charged with the commission of a misdemeanor. If the district attorney approves the extension, the district attorney shall notify the court and the court shall order an extension of the stay of criminal proceedings for the approved period of time.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> The amendments to ORS 135.896 by section 1 of this 2015 Act apply to di version agreements entered into on or after the effective date of this 2015 Act.
