## House Bill 3011

Sponsored by Representative BENTZ; Senators BOQUIST, FERRIOLI (at the request of David Dickerson)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Allows dispensary for Class 1 flammable liquids located in low-population area to permit selfdispensing of liquids when no owner, operator or employee of dispensary is present.

Relating to the	operation of devices for dispensing Class 1 flammable liquids.
Be It Enacted	by the People of the State of Oregon:
SECTION 2	1. Section 2 of this 2015 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 480.315 to
480.385.	
SECTION 2	2. (1) As used in this section, "low-population area" means those parts of a
county that, ba	ased on a certificate of estimated population prepared under ORS 190.510 to
190.610:	
(a) Are out	side of a city having an official population of more than; and
(b) Have ar	official population that averages not more than people per square mile.
(2) Notwith	standing ORS 480.330 and 480.340, if a filling station, service station, garage
or other dispe	nsary where Class 1 flammable liquids are dispensed at retail is located in a
low-population	area, the owner or operator may, during hours that no owner, operator or
employee is pr	esent at the dispensary:
(a) Permit	a person other than the owner, operator or employee to use or manipulate a
device for disp	ensing liquids into the fuel tank of a motor vehicle or other retail container;
(b) Permit	the use of an installed coin-operated or self-service dispensing device for the
liquids; and	
(c) Allow t	he use of an automatic nozzle to dispense the liquids without the owner, op-
erator or an er	nployee being in the immediate vicinity of the tank or container being filled.
(3) A dispen	nsary described in this section is not subject to any provisions of ORS 480.315
to 480.385 regu	lating nonretail facilities.
