House Bill 3095

Sponsored by Representative BENTZ; Representatives ESQUIVEL, KRIEGER, WHISNANT

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Directs State Registrar of Center for Health Statistics to adopt rules requiring each report of death submitted to Center for Health Statistics to identify whether known cause of death is related to using marijuana or product into which cannabinoids have been incorporated.

Becomes operative January 1, 2016.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to reports of death; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2015 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 432.

SECTION 2. The State Registrar of the Center for Health Statistics shall adopt rules requiring each report of death submitted to the Center for Health Statistics under ORS 432.133 to identify whether the known cause of death is related to using marijuana or a product into which cannabinoids have been incorporated.

SECTION 3. Section 2 of this 2015 Act applies to reports of death submitted to the Center for Health Statistics under ORS 432.133 on and after the operative date specified in section 4 of this 2015 Act.

SECTION 4. (1) Section 2 of this 2015 Act becomes operative on January 1, 2016.

(2) The State Registrar of the Center for Health Statistics may take any action before the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section that is necessary to enable the registrar to exercise, on and after the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section, all the duties, powers and functions conferred on the registrar by section 2 of this 2015 Act.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on its passage.
