## House Bill 3116

Sponsored by Representative WITT

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Establishes task force to study how to provide benefits for disabled veterans through preferred worker program and to make recommendations for legislation to include disabled veterans in preferred worker program. Requires task force to submit recommendations to Legislative Assembly by September 15, 2016.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to Task Force on Including Disabled Veterans in the Preferred Worker Program; and de-2 3 claring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 4

SECTION 1. As used in section 2 of this 2015 Act, "preferred worker program" means the 5

program administered by the Workers' Compensation Division of the Department of Con-6

sumer and Business Services as referenced in ORS 656.340. 7

SECTION 2. (1) The Task Force on Including Disabled Veterans in the Preferred Worker 8 9 Program is established, consisting of 11 members appointed as follows:

10 (a) The President of the Senate shall appoint one member from among members of the

Senate. 11

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12 (b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint one member from among 13 members of the House of Representatives.

(c) The Governor shall appoint nine members, three of whom shall represent disabled 14 veterans in this state, three of whom shall possess working knowledge of programs funded 15 by the Workers' Benefit Fund, one of whom shall represent the Department of Veterans' 16 Affairs, one of whom shall represent the Department of Consumer and Business Services and 17 possess expertise in the preferred worker program and one of whom shall represent the in-18 terests of the public. 19

20 (2) The task force shall collect and synthesize information about potential inclusion of disabled veterans in the preferred worker program. The task force shall also make recom-21 mendations for legislation regarding the inclusion of disabled veterans in the preferred 22 23worker program.

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(3) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business. 25

26 (4) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the voting 27 members of the task force.

(5) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson. 28

29 (6) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appointment to become immediately effective. 30

1 (7) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson 2 or of a majority of the voting members of the task force.

3 (8) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.

4 (9) The task force shall submit a report and the recommendations described in subsection
5 (2) of this section to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to business
6 and labor as appropriate no later than September 15, 2016.

7 (10) The Department of Consumer and Business Services shall provide staff support to
 8 the task force.

9 (11) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legislative Assembly are not 10 entitled to compensation, but may be reimbursed for actual and necessary travel and other 11 expenses incurred by them in the performance of their official duties in the manner and 12 amounts provided for in ORS 292.495. Claims for expenses incurred in performing functions 13 of the task force shall be paid out of funds appropriated to the Department of Consumer and 14 Business Services for purposes of the task force.

(12) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force consider necessary to perform their duties.

19 SECTION 3. Section 2 of this 2015 Act is repealed on December 31, 2016.

20 <u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 21 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect 22 on its passage.

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
