

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 3143

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 27 and delete page 2 and insert:

2 “**SECTION 1.** (1) As used in this section, ‘tax-exempt’ means recognized as tax-exempt
3 under section 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code.

4 “(2) A tax-exempt nonprofit organization may supply to the Oregon Liquor Control
5 Commission copies of informational materials about human trafficking. The organization
6 may not charge the commission for the materials. The form of the materials may include,
7 but need not be limited to, adhesive stickers. The materials may not include information on
8 topics other than human trafficking. The materials must be limited in content to objectively
9 verifiable information, except that the materials may include logos, symbols, graphics or
10 similar devices and may include a cover letter to commission licensees to urge the licensees
11 to post the adhesive materials or other materials at the licensees’ premises.

12 “(3) Except as provided in this subsection, if a tax-exempt nonprofit organization supplies
13 the commission with informational materials as described in subsection (2) of this section,
14 the commission shall include a copy of the materials with each license renewal notice that
15 the commission sends to an on-premises sales, off-premises sales or brewery-public house
16 licensee. The number of copies of the materials that the commission sends to licensees may
17 not exceed the number of copies that the organization supplies to the commission. If the
18 commission determines that the informational materials have offensive or inappropriate
19 content, the commission may refuse to include the materials with license renewal notices
20 or otherwise assist in distributing the materials.

21 “**SECTION 2.** Section 1 of this 2015 Act applies to license renewal notices that the Oregon
22 Liquor Control Commission sends to licensees on or after the effective date of this 2015 Act.

23 “**SECTION 3.** Section 1 of this 2015 Act is repealed on January 2, 2018.

24 “**SECTION 4.** This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
25 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect
26 on its passage.”

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
