SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Removes time limitation on judgments subject to laws regarding multiple child support judgments.

2	Relating to multiple child support judgments; amending section 1, chapter 83, Oregon Laws 2005.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. Section 1, chapter 83, Oregon Laws 2005, as amended by section 2, chapter 356,
5	Oregon Laws 2007, is amended to read:
6	Sec. 1. (1) As used in this section:
7	(a) "Administrator" has the meaning given that term in ORS 25.010.
8	(b) "Child support judgment" has the meaning given that term in ORS 25.089.
9	(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of ORS 25.089, 25.091 and 416.448 to the contrary, the [mon-
10	etary support] terms of a child support judgment originating under ORS 416.440 are terminated by
11	the [monetary support] terms of a later-issued child support judgment of a court if:
12	(a) The two child support judgments involve the same obligor and child and the same period;
13	(b) The administrator [was] is providing services under ORS 25.080;
14	[(c) The later-issued child support judgment was entered before January 1, 2004;]
15	[(d)] (c) The administrator or a court [gave] gives the later-issued child support judgment pre-
16	cedence over the earlier-issued child support judgment originating under ORS 416.440; and
17	[(e)] (d) All parties had an opportunity to challenge the amount of child support ordered in the
18	later-issued child support judgment.
19	(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of ORS 25.091 (11) and 416.448 (7), for purposes of reconciling
20	any [monetary] support [arrears or credits] payment records under the two child support judgments
21	described in subsection (2) of this section:
22	(a) The [monetary support] terms of the child support judgment originating under ORS 416.440
23	are deemed terminated on the effective date of the later-issued child support judgment; and
24	(b) Entry of the later-issued child support judgment does not affect any support payment
25	arrearage or credit that has accrued under the earlier-issued child support judgment originating
26	under ORS 416.440.
