## House Bill 3207

Sponsored by JOINT COMMITTEE ON IMPLEMENTING MEASURE 91

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

1	A BILL FOR AN ACT
<b>2</b>	Relating to marijuana; amending section 1, chapter 1, Oregon Laws 2015.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. Section 1, chapter 1, Oregon Laws 2015, is amended to read:
5	Sec. 1. (1) The People of the State of Oregon declare that the purposes of sections 3 to 70,
6	chapter 1, Oregon Laws 2015, [this Act] are:
7	(a) To eliminate the problems caused by the prohibition and uncontrolled manufacture,
8	delivery[,] and possession of marijuana within this state;
9	(b) To protect the safety, welfare, health[,] and peace of the people of this state by prioritizing
10	the state's limited law enforcement resources in the most effective, consistent[,] and rational way;
11	(c) To permit persons licensed, controlled, regulated[,] and taxed by this state to legally manu-
12	facture and sell marijuana to persons 21 years of age and older, subject to the provisions of sections
13	3 to 70, chapter 1, Oregon Laws 2015 [this Act];
14	(d) To ensure that the State Department of Agriculture issues industrial hemp licenses and ag-
15	ricultural hemp seed production permits in accordance with existing state law; and
16	(e) To establish a comprehensive regulatory framework concerning marijuana under existing
17	state law.
18	(2) The People of the State of Oregon intend that the provisions of sections 3 to 70, chapter
19	1, Oregon Laws 2015 [this Act], together with the other provisions of existing state law, will:
20	(a) Prevent the distribution of marijuana to persons under 21 years of age;
21	(b) Prevent revenue from the sale of marijuana from going to criminal enterprises, gangs[,] and
22	cartels;
23	(c) Prevent the diversion of marijuana from this state to other states;
24	(d) Prevent marijuana activity that is legal under state law from being used as a cover or pre-
25	text for the trafficking of other illegal drugs or other illegal activity;
26	(e) Prevent violence and the use of firearms in the cultivation and distribution of marijuana;
27	(f) Prevent drugged driving and the exacerbation of other adverse public health consequences
28	associated with the use of marijuana;
29	(g) Prevent the growing of marijuana on public lands and the attendant public safety and envi-
30	ronmental dangers posed by marijuana production on public lands; and
31	(h) Prevent the possession and use of marijuana on federal property.
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
