78th OREGON LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY--2015 Regular Session

House Bill 3209

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON RURAL COMMUNITIES, LAND USE, AND WATER

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Establishes Task Force on Uses of Forestland. Directs task force to study, evaluate and report on land uses, including nonresource uses, allowed in forest zones and farm zones. Sunsets task force on December 31, 2016. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to land use of forestland; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Task Force on Uses of Forestland is established, consisting of seven

5 members appointed or selected as follows:

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6 (a) The President of the Senate shall appoint one member from among members of the 7 Senate.

8 (b) The Minority Leader of the Senate shall appoint one member from among members
9 of the Senate.

(c) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint one member from among
 members of the House of Representatives.

(d) The Minority Leader of the House of Representatives shall appoint one member from
 among members of the House of Representatives.

14 (e) The President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Mi-

- nority Leader of the Senate and the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives jointly
 shall appoint:
- (A) One public member who is a nonindustrial private forest landowner, as defined in
 ORS 526.005.

19 (B) One public member who is an industrial private forest landowner.

20 (f) The Director of the Department of Land Conservation and Development, or a designee

21 of the director, shall serve as a member of the task force.

22 (2) The task force shall:

23 (a) Study the land uses allowed in forest zones, including mixed farm and forest zones.

24 (b) Study the differences in land uses allowed between forest zones and farm zones.

(c) Evaluate whether the differences in land uses allowed in forest zones and farm zones
 are justified based on the primary resource use planned for each type of zone and differing

27 impacts of other land uses on forest use of forestland and farm use of farmland.

(3) In performing the study and evaluation required by subsection (2) of this section, the
 task force shall give particular consideration to the nonresource land uses that are allowed
 in forest zones and farm zones, including residential uses that are not in conjunction with

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1 resource use of forestland or farmland.

2 (4) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction
 3 of business.

4 (5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the members 5 of the task force.

(6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.

7 (7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appoint-8 ment to become immediately effective.

9 (8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson 10 or of a majority of the members of the task force.

11 (9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.

(10) The task force shall submit a report to the Legislative Assembly in the manner
 provided by ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation in the report, no
 later than September 15, 2016.

(11) The Department of Land Conservation and Development shall provide staff support
 to the task force.

(12) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legislative Assembly are not entitled to compensation, but may be reimbursed for actual and necessary travel and other expenses incurred by them in the performance of their official duties in the manner and amounts provided for in ORS 292.495. Claims for expenses incurred in performing functions of the task force must be paid out of funds appropriated to the department for purposes of the task force.

(13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish information and advice as the members of the task force consider necessary to perform their duties.

27 SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2015 Act is repealed on December 31, 2016.

28 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 29 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect 30 on its passage.

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
