A-Engrossed House Bill 3317

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Directs Oregon State Lottery Commission, in coordination with Oregon Liquor Control Commission, to **submit** report biennially on distribution and concentration of video lottery game terminals in relation to **measures of** socioeconomic status **represented at census tract level** of neighborhoods or communities in which premises of video lottery retailers are located.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to video lottery games; amending ORS 461.217.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. ORS 461.217 is amended to read:

461.217. (1) As used in this section[,]:

- (a) "Socioeconomic status" includes factors such as income, poverty status, eligibility for income support, race or ethnicity, educational attainment and unemployment.
- (b) "Video lottery game retailer" means a contractor under contract with the Oregon State Lottery to place video lottery game terminals on premises authorized by the contract.
- (2) A video lottery game terminal that offers a video lottery game authorized by the Director of the Oregon State Lottery:
- (a) May be placed for operation only in or on the premises of an establishment that has a contract with the Oregon State Lottery as a video lottery game retailer.
 - (b) Must be within the control of an employee of the video lottery game retailer.
 - (c) May not be placed in any other business or location.
- (3) A video lottery game terminal may be placed only on the premises of an establishment licensed by the Oregon Liquor Control Commission with a full on-premises sales license, a limited on-premises sales license or a brewery-public house license. A video lottery game terminal may be placed only in that part of the premises that is posted by the Oregon Liquor Control Commission as being closed to minors. In addition to the requirements of this subsection, the director may by rule establish other criteria and conditions as the director determines appropriate for the placement of video lottery game terminals in establishments.
- (4) No more than six video lottery game terminals may be placed in or on premises described in subsection (3) of this section.
- (5) No more than 10 video lottery game terminals may be placed in or on the premises of a race meet licensee licenseed under ORS 462.020 that qualifies as a video lottery game retailer.
 - (6) The Oregon State Lottery Commission, in coordination with the Oregon Liquor Con-

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26 27 trol Commission, shall submit a report to the Legislative Assembly in the manner provided by ORS 192.245 and to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to the Oregon State Lottery on or before October 1 of each even-numbered year. The report must:

- (a) Identify or map the number of video lottery game terminals on the premises of each video lottery retailer and the location of the premises of each video lottery retailer.
- (b) Analyze the distribution and concentration of video lottery game terminals in relation to the measures of socioeconomic status represented at the census tract level of neighborhoods or communities in which the premises of video lottery retailers are located.

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
