## House Bill 3447

Sponsored by Representatives WEIDNER, LININGER; Representatives BOONE, BUEHLER, GOMBERG, HEARD, HOYLE, SMITH, STARK, Senators OLSEN, ROBLAN

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs Land Conservation and Development Commission to develop guidelines for tsunami resilience planning and to require local governments that have communities at substantial risk of experiencing severe impact from tsunami inundation to plan for tsunami resilience.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Land Conservation and Development to pay for tsunami resilience planning.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to land use planning for tsunami resilience.

**3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:** 

4 **<u>SECTION 1.</u>** (1) As used in this section:

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5 (a) "Acute inpatient care facility" means a licensed hospital with an organized medical 6 staff, with permanent facilities that include inpatient beds and with comprehensive medical 7 services, including physician services and continuous nursing services under the supervision 8 of registered nurses, to provide diagnosis and medical or surgical treatment primarily for 9 but not limited to acutely ill patients and accident victims.

10 (b) "Emergency services building" means a public building used for fire protection ser-11 vices, a hospital building that contains an acute inpatient care facility, a police station, a 12 sheriff's office or a similar facility used by a state, county, district or municipal law 13 enforcement agency.

(2) The Land Conservation and Development Commission, in cooperation with the State Department of Geology and Mineral Industries and the Department of Consumer and Business Services, shall develop by goal or rule guidelines, suggested best practices, model plan provisions and recommendations for building code provisions that improve tsunami resilience in communities at substantial risk of experiencing severe impact from a tsunami.

(3) Taking into consideration tsunami inundation maps produced by the State Department of Geology and Mineral Industries, the commission shall adopt provisions by goal or rule that require local governments in which there are communities at substantial risk of experiencing severe impact from a tsunami to:

(a) Adopt provisions of a comprehensive plan and land use regulations designed to mini mize impacts of tsunami inundation and implement best practices to achieve improved
tsunami resilience.

(b) Identify emergency services buildings and other essential community facilities that
are located in a tsunami inundation zone and strategies to facilitate relocation outside
tsunami inundation zones.

29 (4) For the purpose of facilitating tsunami resilience planning by local governments that

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1 have communities at substantial risk of experiencing severe impact from a tsunami, the

2 commission may:

- 3 (a) Develop a work program for the local government in the manner provided for periodic
- 4 review under ORS 197.628 to 197.651.
- 5 (b) Provide the local government with financial assistance for planning.

6 <u>SECTION 2.</u> In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropri-

7 ated to the Department of Land Conservation and Development, out of the General Fund, the
