

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO A-ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL 3470

1 On page 1 of the printed A-engrossed bill, line 2, after “provisions;” delete the rest of the line
2 and delete lines 3 and 4 and insert “amending ORS 184.889, 352.247, 468A.215, 468A.220, 468A.225,
3 468A.230, 468A.235, 468A.240, 468A.245, 468A.250, 468A.255 and 468A.260 and section 9, chapter 751,
4 Oregon Laws 2009; repealing ORS 468A.205; and declaring an emergency.”.

5 On page 3, line 36, after “develop” insert “and adopt by rule”.

6 On page 4, line 17, after “economy,” insert “the workforce,”.

7 Delete lines 27 through 33 and insert:

8 “(4) The Environmental Justice Task Force established under ORS 182.538 shall assist the com-
9 mission in developing the action plan.

10 “(5) The commission shall appoint a business and workforce advisory committee to assist in de-
11 veloping and implementing the action plan. The advisory committee appointed under this subsection
12 shall identify and advise the commission on the potential costs and benefits and risks of the action
13 plan with relation to this state’s economy, workforce and business industries.”.

14 In line 34, delete “(5)(a)” and insert “(6)(a)”.

15 Delete line 45.

16 On page 5, delete line 1 and insert:

17 “(7) The commission shall submit to an appropriate interim committee of the Legislative As-
18 sembly, in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, by November 1 of each odd-numbered year, a report
19 that describes rulemaking and implementation actions taken related to or as part of the action plan
20 required under this section.”.

21 Delete lines 16 and 17.

22 In line 18, delete “(d)” and insert “(c)”.

23 After line 38, insert:

24 “(4) In developing and administering the program under this section, the commission may pursue
25 linkage agreements with market-based programs in other states or countries.”.

26 In line 39, delete “(4)” and insert “(5)”.

27 In line 41, delete “(5)” and insert “(6)”.

28 In line 44, delete “(6)(a)” and insert “(7)(a)”.

29 On page 6, after line 42, insert:

30 “(b) By October 1, 2016, the department shall provide a progress report to the Legislative As-
31 sembly, in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, that describes the proposed rules to be adopted as
32 part of the action plan required under section 7 of this 2015 Act.”.

33 In line 43, delete “(b)” and insert “(c)”.

34 On page 7, line 2, delete “(c)” and insert “(d)”.

35 Delete line 9 and insert:

1 “(a) One member shall have significant experience in manufacturing;
2 “(b) One member shall have significant experience in energy;
3 “(c) One member shall have significant experience in transportation;
4 “(d) One member shall have significant experience in forestry;
5 “(e) One member shall have significant experience in agriculture; and
6 “(f) One member shall have significant experience in environmental policy.
7 “(3) The Governor shall select a chairperson and a vice chairperson from among the members
8 appointed under this section.
9 “(4) The term of office of a member appointed under this section is four years. Before the expi-
10 ration of the term of a member, the Governor shall appoint a successor whose term begins on Jan-
11 uary 31 next following. A member appointed under this section is eligible for reappointment. In case
12 of vacancy for any cause, the Governor shall make an appointment to become immediately effective
13 for the unexpired term.
14 “(5) The members of the commission appointed under this section must be residents of this state.
15 Failure of a member to maintain compliance with the eligibility requirements related to the
16 member’s appointment shall result in disqualification from serving on the commission.
17 “(6) Voting members of the commission appointed under this section are entitled to expenses as
18 provided in ORS 292.495 (2).
19 “**SECTION 20.** ORS 468A.220 is amended to read:
20 “468A.220. (1) In addition to the members appointed under ORS 468A.215, the [*Oregon Global*
21 *Warming Commission*] **Oregon Commission on Climate Change** includes the following ex officio
22 nonvoting members:
23 “(a) The Director of the State Department of Energy;
24 “(b) The Director of Transportation;
25 “(c) The chairperson of the Public Utility Commission of Oregon;
26 “(d) The Director of the Department of Environmental Quality;
27 “(e) The Director of Agriculture;
28 “(f) The State Forester;
29 “(g) The Water Resources Director; and
30 “(h) Three additional ex officio nonvoting members, each from a state agency or an academic
31 institution.
32 “(2) The following representatives of the Legislative Assembly also shall serve as ex officio
33 nonvoting members:
34 “(a) Two members of the Senate, not from the same political party, appointed by the President
35 of the Senate; and
36 “(b) Two members of the House of Representatives, not from the same political party, appointed
37 by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
38 “(3) Each legislative member serves at the pleasure of the appointing authority and may serve
39 so long as the member remains in the chamber of the Legislative Assembly from which the member
40 was appointed.
41 “(4) Notwithstanding ORS 171.072, members of the commission who are members of the Legis-
42 lative Assembly are not entitled to mileage expenses or a per diem and serve as volunteers on the
43 commission.
44 “**SECTION 21.** ORS 468A.225 is amended to read:
45 “468A.225. (1) A majority of the members of the [*Oregon Global Warming Commission*] **Oregon**

1 **Commission on Climate Change** constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business.

2 “(2) The commission shall meet at times and places specified by a majority of the members of
3 the commission.

4 “(3) The State Department of Energy shall provide clerical, technical and management personnel
5 to serve the commission. Other agencies shall provide support as requested by the department or
6 the commission.

7 “**SECTION 22.** ORS 468A.230 is amended to read:

8 “468A.230. The [*Oregon Global Warming Commission*] **Oregon Commission on Climate Change**
9 may adopt by rule such standards and procedures as it considers necessary for the operation of the
10 commission.

11 “**SECTION 23.** ORS 468A.245 is amended to read:

12 “468A.245. The [*Oregon Global Warming Commission*] **Oregon Commission on Climate Change**
13 shall develop an outreach strategy to educate Oregonians about the scientific aspects and economic
14 impacts of global warming and to inform Oregonians of ways to reduce greenhouse gas emissions
15 and ways to prepare for the effects of global warming. The commission, at a minimum, shall work
16 with state and local governments, the State Department of Energy, the Department of Education,
17 the Higher Education Coordinating Commission and businesses to implement the outreach strategy.

18 “**SECTION 24.** ORS 468A.255 is amended to read:

19 “468A.255. The [*Oregon Global Warming Commission*] **Oregon Commission on Climate Change**
20 may recommend to the Governor the formation of citizen advisory groups to explore particular areas
21 of concern with regard to the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions and the effects of global
22 warming.

23 “**SECTION 25.** The repeal of ORS 468A.205 by section 11 of this 2015 Act and the amend-
24 ments to ORS 184.889, 352.247, 468A.215, 468A.220, 468A.225, 468A.230, 468A.235, 468A.240,
25 468A.245, 468A.250, 468A.255 and 468A.260 and section 9, chapter 751, Oregon Laws 2009, by
26 sections 12 to 24 of this 2015 Act become operative on January 1, 2017.”.

27 In line 15, delete “19” and insert “26”.

28 After line 17, insert:

30 **“EMERGENCY CLAUSE**

32 “**SECTION 27.** This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
33 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect
34 on its passage.”.
