

# House Bill 3489

Sponsored by Representative BOONE, Senator ROBLAN (at the request of Pacific NorthWest Economic Region)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires State Board of Examiners for Engineering and Land Surveying to waive fundamentals of engineering examination and practical engineer's examination requirements for professional engineer registration applicant who has held professional engineer registration or license in another jurisdiction for specified period.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to applicants for registration as professional engineers.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2015 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 672.002 to**  
5 **672.325.**

6 **SECTION 2. Notwithstanding ORS 672.095, 672.102 and 672.255, the State Board of Exam-**  
7 **iners for Engineering and Land Surveying shall waive the fundamentals of engineering ex-**  
8 **amination and practical engineer's examination requirements for an applicant for**  
9 **registration as a professional engineer if, prior to the date of the registration application, the**  
10 **applicant has held a registration or license to practice professional engineering:**

11 (1) **For at least 25 years in another state, a territory or possession of the United States**  
12 **or the District of Columbia or in a foreign country other than Canada; or**

13 (2) **For at least eight years in Canada.**

14 **SECTION 3. Section 2 of this 2015 Act applies to professional engineer registration ap-**  
15 **plicants whose applications are received by the State Board of Examiners for Engineering**  
16 **and Land Surveying on or after the effective date of this 2015 Act.**
