SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Decreases certain biennial appropriations made from General Fund to specified state agencies. Decreases limitations on expenditures for certain biennial expenses for specified state agencies. Declares emergency, effective on passage.
