

House Bill 3566

Sponsored by Representatives NEARMAN, PARRISH; Representatives BUEHLER, JOHNSON

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

- Decreases certain biennial appropriations made from General Fund to specified state agencies.
- Decreases limitations on expenditures for certain biennial expenses for specified state agencies.
- Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to state financial administration; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to the Secretary of State by section 1 (1), chapter _____, Oregon Laws 2015 (Enrolled House Bill 5036), for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, is decreased by the following amounts for the following purposes:

SECTION 33. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to the Water Resources Department by section 1, chapter _____, Oregon Laws 2015 (Enrolled House Bill 5042), for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, is decreased by the following amounts for the following purposes:

- (1) Other services..... \$ 230,109
- (2) Other supplies..... \$ 565,843

SECTION 34. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on its passage.
