SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Advocacy Commissions Office for biennial expenses.

Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by office.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2015.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to the financial administration of the Oregon Advocacy Commissions Office; and declaring
3 an emergency.

4 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

5 **SECTION 1. There is appropriated to the Oregon Advocacy Commissions Office, for the**
6 **biennium beginning July 1, 2015, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$604,592.**

7 **SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$42,189**
8 **is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, as the maximum limit for payment of**
9 **expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but ex-**
10 **cluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon Advocacy Com-**
11 **missions Office.**

12 **SECTION 3. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
13 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect**
14 **July 1, 2015.**
