## A-Engrossed House Bill 5006

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Limits for six-year period beginning July 1, 2015, payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by various state agencies for capital construction.

Limits expenditures from federal funds collected or received by Oregon Department of Aviation, Oregon Military Department, **Department of Veterans' Affairs** and State Department of Fish and Wildlife for capital construction for six-year period beginning July 1, 2015

Wildlife for capital construction for six-year period beginning July 1, 2015.

Limits for six-year period beginning July 1, 2015, payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and certain federal funds, but excluding lottery funds and other federal funds, collected or received by Higher Education Coordinating Commission for expenditures of bond proceeds for benefit of public universities.

Sets expiration date on project approvals and expenditure limitations. Extends expiration dates for certain projects.

[Authorizes sale of bonds under Article XI-G of Oregon Constitution for previously approved projects.]

Modifies name of previously approved project.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2015.

4	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2015, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the state agencies listed, for the acquisition of land and the acquisition, planning, constructing, altering, repairing, furnishing and equipping of buildings and facilities:

Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2015, as the maximum limits for the expenditure of federal funds collected or received by the state agencies listed, for the acquisition of land and the acquisition, planning, constructing, altering, repairing, furnishing and equipping of buildings and facilities:

SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$311,267,945 is established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2015, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and reimbursements from federal service agreements, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not described in this section, collected or received by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission, for expenditures of proceeds from state bonds issued for the benefit of a public university, pursuant to agreements between the commission and a public university.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> The project approvals and expenditure limitations in sections 1, 2 and 3 of this 2015 Act expire on June 30, 2021, unless otherwise noted.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> The expiration dates of the project approvals and expenditure limitations authorized by the Legislative Assembly for the following projects are extended to the following dates:

<u>SECTION 7.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$2,082,893 is established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2013, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and federal funds, but excluding lottery funds, collected or received by the Oregon Military Department, for the acquisition of land and the acquisition, planning, constructing, altering, repairing, furnishing and equipping of the Oregon Military Museum.

<u>SECTION 8.</u> This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on July 1, 2015.
