SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Environmental Quality for certain biennial expenses.

Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Re-ceipts, specified bond proceeds and specified federal funds, but excluding lottery funds and other federal funds, collected or received by department. Limits biennial expenditures from lottery moneys allocated from Parks and Natural Resources

Fund to department.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Authorizes specified nonlimited expenditures.

Limits certain biennial expenditures by department from federal funds. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2015.

4	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
5	SECTION 1. There are appropriated to the Department of Environmental Quality, for the
6	biennium beginning July 1, 2015, out of the General Fund, the following amounts, for the
7	following purposes:
8	(1) Air quality \$ 6,231,949
9	(2) Water quality \$ 22,952,533
10	(3) Land quality \$ 675,849
11	(4) Debt service \$ 3,858,012
12	SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts
13	are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, as the maximum limits for payment
14	of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, the
15	proceeds of bonds for the Orphan Site Account and federal funds from congestion mitigation
16	and air quality grants, drinking water protection, beach bacteria monitoring, laboratory ac-
17	creditation and woodstove grants and for smoke monitoring laboratory services, but exclud-
18	ing lottery funds and federal funds not described in this section, collected or received by the
19	Department of Environmental Quality, for the following purposes:
20	(1) Air quality \$ 44,021,591
21	(2) Water quality \$ 23,844,791
22	(3) Land quality \$ 56,379,189
23	(4) Agency management \$ 25,578,166

Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of 1 2 \$3,955,299 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the Parks and Natural Resources 3 Fund to the Department of Environmental Quality for activities and projects to implement 4 Article XV, section 4 (8), of the Oregon Constitution. 5 SECTION 4. For the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, the following expenditures by the 6 **Department of Environmental Quality are not limited:** 7 (1) Expenditures for debt service and debt service administrative costs related to the 8 9 Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund and the Pollution Control Fund; and (2) Expenditures made for loans made from the Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund 10 and loans from the Pollution Control Fund. 11 12SECTION 5. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public

peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect July 1, 2015.

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
