CHAPTER	
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AN ACT

Relating to the financial administration of the Higher Education Coordinating Commission; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> There are appropriated to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, out of the General Fund, the following amounts for the following purposes:

SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$10,462,066 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for debt service on lottery bonds sold for the benefit of Oregon community colleges.

SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$31,887,710 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, as the maximum limit for

payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for debt service on lottery bonds sold for the benefit of Oregon public universities.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$11,816,379 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the Education Stability Fund to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for Oregon Opportunity Grants.

SECTION 5. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission, for the following purposes:

- (1) Operations, degree authorization and private career schools...... \$ 2,180,258
- (2) Office of Community
 Colleges and Workforce
 Development operations
 and federal/other support \$ 4,430,977

SECTION 6. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from federal funds collected or received by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission, for the following purposes:

- (1) Operations, degree authorization and private career schools...... \$ 433,760
- (2) Office of Community
 Colleges and Workforce
 Development operations
 and federal/other support \$108,779,812

SECTION 7. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$45,810 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, as the maximum limit for the payment of expenses by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission from the moneys received from the Western Oregon Timber Severance Tax Fund and the Eastern Oregon Timber Severance Tax Fund for the Community College Support Fund.

<u>SECTION 8.</u> For the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, expenditures by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for debt service on general obligation bonds and certificates of participation issued for the benefit of public universities and paid with resources received from the public universities are not limited.

<u>SECTION 9.</u> For the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, expenditures by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for payments to individuals, organizations or units of government from federal National Emergency Grant funds are not limited.

<u>SECTION 10.</u> For the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, expenditures by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for federal funds debt service on Build America Bonds sold for the benefit of Oregon public universities and community colleges are not limited.

<u>SECTION 11.</u> For the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, expenditures by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission of moneys from the Tuition Protection Fund are not limited.

SECTION 12. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$8,240,000 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission from the Sports Lottery Account for the benefit of Oregon public universities.

SECTION 13. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate protection of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect July 1, 2015.
