House Bill 5024

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Presession filed (at the request of Oregon Department of Administrative Services)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Higher Education Coordinating Commission for biennial expenses.

Limits biennial expenditures by Higher Education Coordinating Commission from lottery moneys for debt service on lottery bonds and for Oregon Opportunity Grants. Limits biennial expenditures by Higher Education Coordinating Commission from lottery moneys

Limits biennial expenditures by Higher Education Coordinating Commission from lottery moneys allocated from Education Stability Fund for Oregon Opportunity Grants.

Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by Higher Education Coordinating Commission for certain purposes. Limits biennial expenditures of Higher Education Coordinating Commission from federal funds

Limits biennial expenditures of Higher Education Coordinating Commission from federal funds for certain purposes.

Limits biennial expenditures by Higher Education Coordinating Commission from timber tax funds for Community College Support Fund.

Limits biennial expenditures by Higher Education Coordinating Commission from Oregon Health and Science University Bond Fund.

Authorizes specified nonlimited expenditures. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2015.

SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$10,655,083 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for debt service on lottery bonds sold for the benefit of Oregon community colleges.

26 <u>SECTION 3.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of 27 \$31,986,569 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, as the maximum limit for 28 payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Eco-29 nomic Development Fund to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for debt service 30 on lottery bonds sold for the benefit of Oregon public universities.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$3,060,871 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the Education Stability Fund to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for Oregon Opportunity Grants.

35 <u>SECTION 5.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of 36 \$10,827,615 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, as the maximum limit for 37 payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Eco-38 nomic Development Fund to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for Oregon Op-39 portunity Grants.

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<u>SECTION 12.</u> For the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, expenditures by the Higher Edu cation Coordinating Commission of moneys from the Tuition Protection Fund are not limited.
<u>SECTION 13.</u> This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate protection of the public
peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect
July 1, 2015.

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
