HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 5029

On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 27 and delete pages 2 and 3 and insert: 1 $\mathbf{2}$ "SECTION 1. During the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, all lottery revenues available 3 to benefit the public purposes specified in Article XV, section 4, of the Oregon Constitution, that are in excess of distributions or allocations required by law shall be maintained in the 4 $\mathbf{5}$ Administrative Services Economic Development Fund. 6 "SECTION 2. All moneys in the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund as 7 of July 1, 2015, and thereafter are reserved to meet the commitments of sections 1 to 13 of this 2015 Act. 8 9 "SECTION 3. The following amounts are allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the Oregon Business 10 11 Development Department, for the following purposes: Shared services \$ 7,037,404 12(1) 13 (2) **Business**, innovation 14 and trade.....\$ 50,866,257 15(3) Infrastructure Finance Authority...... \$ 3,025,181 16 Oregon Film and Video Office .. \$ 1,164,460 17 (4) 18 "SECTION 4. There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, from the Ad-19 ministrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the Department of Education, for the 20 State School Fund, the amount of \$408,150,516. 21"SECTION 5. There is transferred to the Lottery Bond Fund for the biennium beginning 22July 1, 2015, out of the Oregon Education Fund, 100 percent of the declared earnings on the Education Stability Fund that are transferred to the Oregon Education Fund during the 2324 biennium beginning July 1, 2015, to be used by the Department of Education for the purposes 25of maintaining cash flow and paying, when due, the principal, interest and premium, if any, 26 on outstanding education lottery bonds. 27"SECTION 6. There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, from the Ad-28ministrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the office of the Governor, the 29 amount of \$4,058,418 for expenses of the Regional Solutions Program. "SECTION 7. (1) The Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall establish a 30 31 process for allocating available moneys in the Administrative Services Economic Develop-32ment Fund on a quarterly basis to fulfill the biennial allocations made by sections 1 to 13 of 33 this 2015 Act. The department shall set the quarterly allocations.

34 "(2) If, in any quarter, the moneys transferred from the State Lottery Fund to the Ad-35 ministrative Services Economic Development Fund are insufficient to pay for the quarterly allocations made by sections 1 to 13 of this 2015 Act or any other 2015 Act, prior to making
any other allocations pursuant to sections 1 to 13 of this 2015 Act, the department shall
satisfy lottery bond debt service obligations in the amount of \$225,477,038 for outstanding
lottery bonds.

5 "(3) After the lottery bond debt service obligations described in subsection (2) of this 6 section are satisfied, if the remaining moneys transferred from the State Lottery Fund to 7 the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund are insufficient to pay for the 8 quarterly allocations made by sections 1 to 13 of this 2015 Act, the department shall reduce 9 the quarterly allocations not described in subsection (2) of this section proportionately in 10 amounts sufficient to accommodate the revenue shortfall.

¹¹ "<u>SECTION 8.</u> There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, from the Ad-¹² ministrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the Oregon Department of Adminis-¹³ trative Services, the amount of \$225,477,038 for the purpose of paying, when due, the ¹⁴ principal, interest and premium, if any, on outstanding lottery bonds, as described in section ¹⁵ 7 of this 2015 Act.

16 "<u>SECTION 9.</u> Notwithstanding and in lieu of the requirement in ORS 461.547 (1) for a 17 percentage-based transfer of moneys, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, the amount 18 allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the Oregon De-19 partment of Administrative Services for distribution to counties for economic development 20 activities as provided by ORS 461.547 is \$39,083,827.

21 "<u>SECTION 10.</u> Notwithstanding and in lieu of the requirement in ORS 461.549 (2) for a 22 percentage-based transfer of moneys, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, the amount 23 allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the Problem 24 Gambling Treatment Fund is \$11,292,544.

<u>* SECTION 11.</u> Notwithstanding and in lieu of the requirement in ORS 565.447 for a
 percentage-based transfer of moneys, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, the amount
 allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the County Fair
 Account established in ORS 565.445 is \$3,864,000.

29 "<u>SECTION 12.</u> Notwithstanding and in lieu of the requirement in ORS 461.543 (4) for a 30 percentage-based transfer of moneys, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, the amount 31 allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the Sports Lot-32 tery Account is \$8,240,000.

"<u>SECTION 13.</u> There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, from the Ad ministrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the State Forestry Department, the
 amount of \$5,000,000 for federal forest restoration.

16 "<u>SECTION 20.</u> After distributing the amounts specified in sections 15 to 19 of this 2015 17 Act, the Department of Revenue shall distribute funds remaining in the Criminal Fine Ac-18 count to the General Fund.

"SECTION 21. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect
July 1, 2015.".

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
