SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Recognizes and honors Officer Jimmy Lee Shoop (1947-1981) for his service to this state.

2	Whereas Deputy Sheriff Jimmy Lee Shoop was born on September 26, 1947, in Imperial
3	Nebraska, alongside his twin sister, Janet Faye Shoop; and
4	Whereas the head nurse at the hospital where the twins were born called Mona and Charles
5	Shoop to inform them that a child had been born who was up for adoption, not realizing that there
6	were two children up for adoption; and
7	Whereas Mona and Charles Shoop were thrilled to discover that they were able to adopt twins
8	and at three days old, the twins were placed on a train to Portland, Oregon, where the Shoops lived
9	and
10	Whereas Officer Shoop graduated from David Douglas High School, where he was active in
11	sports activities, in 1965; and
12	Whereas Officer Shoop had three children; and
13	Whereas Officer Shoop later met and married his second wife, Vicki, who was also a police of
14	ficer; and
15	Whereas Officer Shoop began working the night shift part-time as a reserve sheriff for Estacada
16	in the mid-1970s, graduated from the Police Academy in 1978 and subsequently joined the Clackamas
17	County Sheriff's Office; and
18	Whereas at only 34 years of age, Officer Shoop was killed in the line of duty when he was hit
19	by a drunk driver on November 7, 1981; and
20	Whereas Officer Shoop loved being a police officer, enjoyed fishing in his spare time and was
21	a very family-oriented man who was loved by many and is greatly missed; and
22	Whereas Officer Shoop is survived by his sister, his wife and his three children; now, therefore
23	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
24	That we, the members of the Seventy-eighth Legislative Assembly, recognize and honor Officer
25	Jimmy Lee Shoop for his service to this state.
