Recognizes and honors Officer Jimmy Lee Shoop (1947-1981) for his service to this state.

2	Whereas Deputy Sheriff Jimmy Lee Shoop was born on September 26, 1947, in Imperia
3	Nebraska, alongside his twin sister, Janet Faye Shoop; and
4	Whereas the head nurse at the hospital where the twins were born called Mona and Charle
5	Shoop to inform them that a child had been born who was up for adoption, not realizing that ther
6	were two children up for adoption; and
7	Whereas Mona and Charles Shoop were thrilled to discover that they were able to adopt twins
8	and at three days old, the twins were placed on a train to Portland, Oregon, where the Shoops lived

10	Whereas Officer Shoop graduated from David Douglas High School, where he was active in
11	sports activities, in 1965; and
12	Whereas Officer Shoop married and had three children, and his wife, Vicki, was also a polic
13	officer; and
14	Whereas Officer Shoop began working the night shift part-time as a reserve sheriff for Estacad
15	in the mid-1970s, graduated from the Police Academy in 1978 and subsequently joined the Clackama
16	County Sheriff's Office; and
17	Whereas at only 34 years of age, Officer Shoop was killed in the line of duty when he was hi
18	by a drunk driver on November 7, 1981; and
19	Whereas Officer Shoop loved being a police officer, enjoyed fishing in his spare time and wa
20	a very family-oriented man who was loved by many and is greatly missed; and
21	Whereas Officer Shoop is survived by his sister, his wife and his three children; now, therefore
