House Joint Memorial 1

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Urges United States Postmaster General and United States Postal Service Board of Governors to recognize zip codes 97223 and 97224 as Tigard zip codes that are separate and distinct from Portland zip codes.

| 9 | Whereas Tigard's roots were as a small farming community, but the arrival of the Oregon |
| 10 | Electric Railway in 1910 led to a period of rapid growth and development; and |
| 11 | Whereas Tigard incorporated as an independent city in 1961; and |
| 12 | Whereas Tigard has continued to experience rapid growth, with a population growth of more |
| 13 | than 16 percent during the first decade of the 21st century; and |
| 14 | Whereas more than 48,000 people live in Tigard, according to the 2010 federal census; and |
| 15 | Whereas Portland is a separate and distinct city located in Multnomah County; and |
| 16 | Whereas the United States Postal Service uses zip codes 97223 and 97224 within Tigard, bu |
| 17 | considers those zip codes as part of Portland; and |
| 18 | Whereas the United States Postal Service designation of zip codes 97223 and 97224 as Portland |
| 19 | zip codes is at odds with public perception and local government organizational structure in Tigarc |
| 20 | and the Portland metropolitan area; now, therefore, |
| 21 | Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon: |
