## **House Joint Memorial 11**

Sponsored by Representatives WHISNANT, GOMBERG

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Urges Congress to enact legislation granting trade promotion authority to President that includes specific parameters on protection of trademarks.

JOINT MEMORIAL

2	To the President of the United States and the Senate and the House of Representatives of the United
3	States of America, in Congress assembled:
4	We, your memorialists, the Seventy-eighth Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon, in leg-
5	islative session assembled, respectfully represent as follows:
6	Whereas trademarks are valuable assets to business; and
7	Whereas trademarks support job creation and economic stability and expand economic prosper-
8	ity throughout the United States; and
9	Whereas intellectual property-intensive industries create millions of jobs in the United States
10	and are responsible for trillions of dollars in United States exports; and
11	Whereas studies show that intellectual property theft accounts for the loss of hundreds of
12	thousands of American jobs and billions of dollars in revenue; and
13	Whereas United States goods and services exports supported an estimated 11.3 million jobs in
14	2013, including 25 percent of all manufacturing jobs; and
15	Whereas growing numbers of fake and counterfeit goods enter the supply chain, posing safety
16	risks to consumers; and
17	Whereas state enforcement of authentic goods and products bearing a legitimate trademark is
18	in the interests of citizens, law enforcement and state and local economies; now, therefore,
19	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
20	That we, the members of the Seventy-eighth Legislative Assembly, respectfully urge the Con-
21	gress of the United States to enact legislation granting the President of the United States trade
22	promotion negotiating authority to set appropriate parameters governing protection of trademarks
23	in any agreement negotiated; and be it further
24	Resolved, That a copy of this memorial be sent to the President of the United States, to the
25	Senate Majority Leader, to the Speaker of the House of Representatives and to each member of the
26	Oregon Congressional Delegation.
