SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Urges Congress to take steps to ease shortage of primary care physicians in Oregon.

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JOINT MEMORIAL

2 To the President of the United States and the Senate and the House of Representatives of the United

3 States of America, in Congress assembled:

We, your memorialists, the Seventy-eighth Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon, in legislative session assembled, respectfully represent as follows:

6 Whereas Oregon is facing a critical shortage of physicians needed to keep up with the health 7 care needs of Oregonians; and

8 Whereas shortfalls in residency slots to train qualified physicians exacerbate physician short-9 ages; and

Whereas federal policy regarding graduate medical education and residency directly impacts
 Oregon's ability to train physicians; and

12 Whereas experts agree that federal level reforms are needed to keep up with health care 13 workforce demands in Oregon; now, therefore,

14 Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:

(1) The Congress of the United States is respectfully urged to remove the cap on primary care medical residency programs, to explore the creation of innovative community-based graduate medical education programs and to implement stronger planning and oversight of the use of public funds for graduate medical education.

(2) A copy of this memorial shall be sent to the President of the United States, to the Senate
Majority leader, to the Speaker of the House of Representatives and to each member of the Oregon
Congressional Delegation.

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
