SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Urges Congress to take steps to ease shortage of physicians in Oregon.

1	JOINT MEMORIAL
2	To the President of the United States and the Senate and the House of Representatives of the United
3	States of America, in Congress assembled:
4	We, your memorialists, the Seventy-eighth Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon, in leg-
5	islative session assembled, respectfully represent as follows:
6	Whereas Oregon is facing a critical shortage of physicians needed to keep up with the health
7	care needs of Oregonians; and
8	Whereas shortfalls in residency slots to train qualified physicians exacerbate physician short-
9	ages; and
10	Whereas federal policy regarding graduate medical education and residency directly impacts
11	Oregon's ability to train physicians; and
12	Whereas experts agree that federal level reforms are needed to keep up with health care
13	workforce demands in Oregon; now, therefore,
14	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
15	(1) The Congress of the United States is respectfully urged to remove the cap on medical resi-
16	dency programs, to explore the creation of innovative community-based graduate medical education
17	programs and to implement stronger planning and oversight of the use of public funds for graduate
18	medical education.
19	(2) A copy of this memorial shall be sent to the President of the United States, to the Senate
20	Majority leader, to the Speaker of the House of Representatives and to each member of the Oregon
21	Congressional Delegation.
