House Joint Memorial 8

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requests President, Congress and United States Secretary of Education to amend federal law to replace annual computer-based multiple choice tests with limited essay-based assessments.

 To the President of the United States, the Senate and the House of Representatives of the United

3 States of America, in Congress assembled, and the United States Secretary of Education:

We, your memorialists, the Seventy-eighth Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon, in legislative session assembled, respectfully represent as follows:

6 Whereas students in grades three through eight take annual computer-based multiple choice 7 tests in mathematics and reading to comply with federal law requirements; and

8 Whereas time taking the tests is time when a student is not receiving instruction; and

9 Whereas the heavy emphasis on tests results in a skewing of curriculum to the content of the 10 test; now, therefore,

11 Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:

(1) The President, the Congress of the United States and the United States Secretary of Education are respectfully requested to amend federal law to eliminate requirements for annual computer-based multiple choice tests and to instead use essay-based assessments that are administered no more than once every three years from kindergarten through grade 10.

(2) A copy of this memorial shall be sent to the President, the Secretary of Education and each
 member of the Oregon Congressional Delegation.
