## Senate Bill 114

Sponsored by Senator DEMBROW, Representatives VEGA PEDERSON, LIVELY (Presession filed.)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs Oregon Education Investment Board to evaluate methods for providing components of two-generation strategy to address poverty. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to a two-generation strategy to address poverty; and declaring an emergency.

**3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:** 

SECTION 1. (1) The Oregon Education Investment Board, in consultation with the Early 4 Learning Council and the Higher Education Coordinating Commission, shall evaluate meth- $\mathbf{5}$ ods for providing the components of a two-generation strategy to address poverty. The pur-6 pose of a two-generation strategy to address poverty is to break the cycle of poverty by 7 8 concurrently addressing the needs of children in poverty and their parents. (2) For the purpose of this section, a two-generation strategy to address poverty includes 9 at least the following components: 10 (a) Enrolling children in poverty in high-quality prekindergarten programs; 11 (b) Enrolling parents of children in poverty in post-secondary education to earn high-12 value certificates or degrees; and 13(c) Supporting parents in their post-secondary education through mentorships, tuition 14 assistance, housing assistance and any other assistance necessary to improve their success. 15 (3) When conducting the evaluation, the board shall: 16 (a) Explore possible partnerships with public and private entities; and 17(b) Identify the elements for a proposed pilot program that implements a two-generation 18 19 strategy to address poverty. 20 (4) The board shall make a report to the committees of the Legislative Assembly related to education no later than March 1, 2016. 21SECTION 2. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 2223peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on its passage. 24

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
