## Senate Bill 124

Sponsored by Senator WHITSETT, Representative WHITSETT (Presession filed.)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Creates crimes of unlawful manufacture of marijuana within 1,000 feet of school zone and unlawful delivery of marijuana within 1,000 feet of school zone. Punishes by maximum five years' imprisonment, \$125,000 fine, or both.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to marijuana; creating new provisions; amending ORS 475.858 and 475.862; and declaring

3 an emergency.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 475.858 is amended to read:

6 475.858. (1) It is unlawful for any person to manufacture marijuana within 1,000 feet of:

7 (a) The real property comprising a public or private elementary, secondary or career school 8 attended primarily by minors.

9 (b) A school zone, as defined in ORS 801.462.

10 (2)(a) Unlawful manufacture of marijuana within 1,000 feet of a school is a Class A felony.

- 11 (b) Unlawful manufacture of marijuana within 1,000 feet of a school zone is a Class C
- 12 felony.

13 SECTION 2. ORS 475.862 is amended to read:

14 475.862. (1) It is unlawful for any person to deliver marijuana within 1,000 feet of:

(a) The real property comprising a public or private elementary, secondary or career schoolattended primarily by minors.

17 (b) A school zone, as defined in ORS 801.462.

18 (2)(a) Unlawful delivery of marijuana within 1,000 feet of a school is a Class A felony.

19 (b) Unlawful delivery of marijuana within 1,000 feet of a school zone is a Class C felony.

20 <u>SECTION 3.</u> The amendments to ORS 475.858 and 475.862 by sections 1 and 2 of this 2015

21 Act apply to conduct occurring on and after the effective date of this 2015 Act.

22 <u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 23 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect 24 on its passage.
