Senate Bill 148

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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Changes State Board of Pharmacy membership to include one licensed pharmacy technician and remove one member of public.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to the State Board of Pharmacy; creating new provisions; amending ORS 689.115; and de-3 claring an emergency.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 689.115 is amended to read:

6 689.115. (1) The State Board of Pharmacy consists of seven members appointed by the Governor 7 and subject to confirmation by the Senate in the manner provided in ORS 171.562 and 171.565. All

8 members of the board must be residents of this state. Of the members of the board:

9 (a) Five must be licensed pharmacists.

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10 (b) [*Two*] **One** must be a licensed pharmacy technician.

(c) One must be a [members] member of the public who [are] is not a licensed [pharmacists]
 pharmacist or a spouse, domestic partner, child, parent or sibling of a pharmacist.

(2)(a) Board members required to be licensed pharmacists may be selected by the Governor from
a list of three to five nominees for each vacancy, submitted by a task force assembled by the Oregon
State Pharmacy Association to represent all of the interested pharmacy groups.

(b) The licensed pharmacy technician member of the board must, at the time of ap pointment:

(A) Be licensed and in good standing to perform the duties of a pharmacy technician in
 this state;

(B) Be engaged in the performance of the duties of a pharmacy technician in this state;
 and

(C) Have at least three years of experience in performing the duties of a pharmacy
 technician in this state after licensure.

[(b)] (c) The public [members] member of the State Board of Pharmacy must be an [individuals] individual who:

26 (A) [*Have*] **Has** attained the age of majority;

27 (B) [Are] Is not a current or former [members] member of the profession of pharmacy;

28 (C) [Do] **Does** not have and [have] **has** never had any material financial interest in the providing 29 of pharmacy service; and

30 (D) [Have] Has not engaged in any activity directly related to the practice of pharmacy.

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[(c)] (d) The licensed pharmacist members of the board must, at the time of [their] appointment:

1 2 (A) Be licensed and in good standing to engage in the practice of pharmacy in this state;

(B) Be engaged in the practice of pharmacy in this state; and 3

(C) Have five years of experience in the practice of pharmacy in this state after licensure. 4

[(d)] (e) In selecting the members of the board, the Governor shall strive to balance the repre-5 sentation on the board according to: 6

(A) Geographic areas of this state; and 7

(B) Ethnic group. 8

9 (3)(a) The term of office of each member is four years, but a member serves at the pleasure of the Governor. The terms must be staggered so that no more than three terms end each year. A 10 member is eligible for reappointment. The Governor shall fill vacancies which occur by expiration 11 12 of full terms within 90 days prior to each date of expiration, and shall fill vacancies which occur for 13 any other reason within 60 days after each such vacancy occurs, for the unexpired term.

(b) A board member shall be removed immediately from the board if, during the member's term, 14 15 the member:

16 (A) Is not a resident of this state;

(B) Has been absent from three consecutive board meetings, unless at least one absence is ex-17 cused; [or] 18

(C) Is not a licensed pharmacist or a retired pharmacist who was a licensed pharmacist in good 19 standing at the time of retirement, if the board member was appointed to serve on the board as a 20pharmacist; or 21

22(D) Ceases to be a licensed pharmacy technician, if the board member was appointed to 23serve on the board as a pharmacy technician.

(4) Members of the board are entitled to compensation and expenses as provided in ORS 292.495. 94 The board may provide by rule for compensation to board members for the performance of official 2526

27SECTION 2. The Governor shall appoint a licensed pharmacy technician as required under section 1 (1)(b) of this 2015 Act to the State Board of Pharmacy at the next expiration 28of the term of a board member who is a member of the public. 29

SECTION 3. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect

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
