## SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 159

On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after "171.130," insert "171.557,". 1 2 On page 5, delete lines 6 through 43 and insert: "SECTION 10. ORS 291.110 is amended to read: 3 "291.110. (1) The Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall ensure that state agency 4  $\mathbf{5}$ activities and programs are directed toward achieving [the Oregon benchmarks] performance out-6 **comes**. The department shall: 7 "(a) Monitor progress, identify barriers and generate alternative approaches for attaining [the 8 benchmarks] performance outcomes. 9 "(b) Ensure the development of a statewide system of performance measures designed to increase the efficiency and effectiveness of state programs and services. 10 11 "(c) Provide agencies with direction on the appropriate format for reporting performance meas-12ures to ensure consistency across agencies. 13 "(d) Consult with the Legislative Assembly to assist in devising a system of performance measures. 14 15"(e) Facilitate the development of performance measures in those instances where [benchmarks] 16 performance measures involve more than one state agency. 17 "(f) Prior to budget development and adoption of a performance measurement system, con-18 sult with the legislative review agency, as defined in ORS 291.371, or other appropriate legislative committee, as determined by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of 19 20 Representatives[, prior to the formal adoption of a performance measurement system]. 21"(g) No later than October 1 of each year, submit a report to the Legislative Fiscal Officer on 22the progress state agencies have made in meeting performance measures. 23 "(2) State agencies shall develop measurable performance measures consistent with and aimed 24 at achieving [Oregon benchmarks] performance outcomes. To that end, each state agency shall: 25"(a) Identify the mission, goals and objectives of the agency and any applicable [benchmarks] 26 performance measures to which the goals are directed. 27(b) Develop written defined performance measures that quantify desired organization interme-28diate outcomes, outputs, responsibilities, results, products and services, and, where possible, develop 29unit cost measures for evaluating [the] program efficiency. 30 "(c) Involve agency managers, supervisors and employees in the development of statements of 31 mission, goals, objectives and performance measures as provided in paragraphs (a) and (b) of this 32subsection and establish teams composed of agency managers, supervisors and employees to imple-33 ment agency goals, objectives and performance measures. Where bargaining unit employees are af-34 fected, they shall have the right to select those employees of the agency, through their labor 35organization, to serve on any joint committees established to develop performance measures.

"(d) Use performance measures to work toward achievement of identified missions, goals[,] and 1 2 objectives [and any applicable benchmarks]. 3 "(e) Review agency performance measures with the appropriate legislative committee, as deter-4 mined by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, during each odd-numbered year regular session of the Legislative Assembly.". 5 6 On page 6, line 19, delete "such". 7 In line 20, delete "as the Oregon benchmarks". On page 9, line 36, delete "cur-" and insert "the cur-". 8 On page 11, line 18, before "Governor's" insert "the". 9 In line 20, before "results" insert "desired". 10 11 On page 48, after line 23, insert: "SECTION 76. ORS 171.557 is amended to read: 12"171.557. (1) The Legislative Assembly finds that there is a need for a comprehensive, specific 13 budget format available to all members of the Legislative Assembly so that: 14 15"(a) Effective policy decisions can be made; 16 "(b) Line items in agency budgets can be identified by program function; "(c) Decisions to increase or decrease agency budgets can be made with knowledge as to policy 1718 and programmatic impact; and 19 "(d) A more objective comparison can be made to the Governor's budget. "(2) The Legislative Assembly also finds that the goal of the legislative budgeting process is to 20 21afford members a thorough understanding of: 22"(a) The policies of state government regarding the definition and delivery of state services; 23"(b) What program functions are necessary to state operations and the cost of these functions; and 24 25"(c) The means whereby these policies and programs are administered. "(3) The goal of the Legislative Assembly is to decide, as a body, which policies and programs 2627are necessary to discharge its public responsibilities. Consequently, the Legislative Assembly finds that there is a need to examine the legislative budgeting process so that: 2829 "(a) Policy decisions are made by the Legislative Assembly as a whole; "(b) Program functions are more closely identified with line items in agency budgets; 30 "(c) Funding options and priorities are defined in terms of policies; and 31"(d) Legislative budgeting identifies programs which are necessary in terms of policies and state 3233 responsibilities, as opposed to the need to maintain existing program activities. (4) The Legislative Fiscal Officer may provide information related to the preparation and 3435 adoption of the legislatively adopted budget, or to measures considered by the Joint Committee on Ways and Means during any session of the Legislative Assembly, to the Oregon 36 37 Department of Administrative Services. Staff of the Oregon Department of Administrative 38 Services may not reveal to any other person the contents or nature of the information provided under this section, except with the written consent of the Legislative Fiscal Officer.". 39 In line 27, delete "76" and insert "77". 40 In line 32, delete "77" and insert "78". 41 42
