

Senate Bill 236

Printed pursuant to Senate Interim Rule 213.28 by order of the President of the Senate in conformance with pre-session filing rules, indicating neither advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President (at the request of Governor John A. Kitzhaber, M.D., for Oregon State Police)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Authorizes Department of State Police to enter into lease agreements and take title to real property as considered necessary by Superintendent of State Police for performance of duties of department and Oregon State Police.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to the authority of the Department of State Police to enter into real property agreements;
3 amending ORS 181.090; and declaring an emergency.

4 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 181.090 is amended to read:

6 181.090. (1) The Superintendent of State Police may establish headquarters and patrol stations
7 at such places as the superintendent considers advisable for the patrol and protection of this state
8 and the enforcement of the laws.

9 (2) For purposes of this section, the superintendent may use lands and buildings for the accom-
10 modation of members of the state police and their vehicles and equipment.

11 **(3) The Department of State Police may enter into such lease agreements and take title**
12 **to such real property as the superintendent considers necessary for the performance of the**
13 **duties of the department and the Oregon State Police.**

14 **SECTION 2.** This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
15 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect
16 on its passage.
