Senate Bill 268

Printed pursuant to Senate Interim Rule 213.28 by order of the President of the Senate in conformance with presession filing rules, indicating neither advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President (at the request of Governor John A. Kitzhaber, M.D., for Water Resources Department)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Creates task force for studying options for providing Water Resources Department with stable budget or increased revenues.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Relating to the Task Force on Water Resources Department Funding; and declaring an emergency.
- 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Task Force on Water Resources Department Funding is established, consisting of not fewer than 10 or more than 16 members appointed as follows:
 - (a) The President of the Senate shall appoint two nonvoting members from among members of the Senate. The two members appointed under this paragraph may not be from the same political party.
 - (b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint two nonvoting members from among members of the House of Representatives. The two members appointed under this paragraph may not be from the same political party.
 - (c) The Water Resources Commission shall appoint one nonvoting member from among members of the commission.
 - (d) The Governor shall appoint not fewer than 5 or more than 11 members. In making appointments to the task force, the Governor shall endeavor, to the extent the Governor deems practicable, to appoint members representative of interests of the conservation community, counties, Indian tribes, industrial water users, irrigated agriculture, irrigation districts and municipal water suppliers.
 - (2) The task force shall identify funding options for providing stable or increased funding for the Water Resources Department. Options reviewed and considered by the task force must include but need not be limited to the establishment of a water right management fee. As part of the option identification process, the task force shall consider:
 - (a) The role for using General Fund moneys to manage the water resources of this state for the benefit of all Oregonians;
 - (b) Whether individual beneficiaries of department services should have greater financial responsibility for the services they receive;
 - (c) Options for preventing new revenues from being used for purposes other than funding of the department;
 - (d) Options for ensuring that General Fund support is not reduced as a result of new fees;

- (e) Improved or new services that would warrant new revenue streams;
- (f) The practicality of proposed options, including but not limited to the logistics of implementation and administration;
- (g) Whether options will result in a stable budget or increased funding for the department; and
 - (h) The equity of proposed options, including but not limited to equity between:
 - (A) Rural and urban areas;

- (B) Agricultural and urban users;
- (C) In-stream and out-of-stream uses; and
- (D) Geographic sectors of this state.
 - (3) The task force may accept comments and exhibits from public and private sources.
- (4) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business.
- (5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the voting members of the task force.
 - (6) The task force shall elect one of its voting members to serve as chairperson.
- (7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.
- (8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the Governor or a representative of the Governor.
 - (9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.
- (10) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, to the Governor, an interim or regular committee of the Legislative Assembly related to natural resources and the Water Resources Commission no later than February 1, 2016.
 - (11) The department shall provide staff support to the task force.
- (12) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legislative Assembly are not entitled to compensation, but may be reimbursed for actual and necessary travel and other expenses incurred by them in the performance of their official duties in the manner and amounts provided for in ORS 292.495. Claims for expenses incurred in performing functions of the task force shall be paid out of funds appropriated to the department for purposes of the task force.
- (13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force consider necessary to perform their duties.
- <u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 1 of this 2015 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the 2017 regular session of the Legislative Assembly as specified in ORS 171.010.
- SECTION 3. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on its passage.
