

Senate Bill 404

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs Oregon Law Commission to study legal definition and status of juvenile delinquency judgments.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to juveniles; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. (1) The Oregon Law Commission shall study the legal definition and status of juvenile delinquency judgments.

(2) The commission shall report on the study to an appropriate committee or interim committee of the Legislative Assembly before December 31, 2015.

SECTION 2. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect on its passage.
